copy of G. letter sends temple write to Bamp. &
pray for be diligent to take such letters of Bamp.
as are under that Name wth was sent to Mr. Hall
full for doubtless you will find some things worth
your paynes in them: this all: from your servant A.

pray for be pleased to give my money to Mr
Pier who is in G. & you may confide in:
& he will remitt it to me wth speede: I will send him
to you & though you neede not tell him my business
as he does not know: yet you may safely deliver any
thing to him: he is an honest man.
