Wednesday evening June 11 1679 Hawack
Scene after I was in bed being perfectly Hawack
pleasant still now, thus abdy went off it
in the midest of an arth but narrow, I went to go up
on stone steps that was there, to go on the bridge to a rock I see on the
other side, But when I come neare, to clime the bridge
went back like a fload or ramboar, So that I see it to
not bee walked on, by a weighty body off flesh, But an
etheriall body, for the bridge was a fload of ore then
frontended my selfe to look on the other side, off the way
to the rock, and I see most pleasant greenes, was green no
ish they grew out of the rock, the rock was exceeding
high, and large, It appeared like severall greenes, and
other pleasant boulders, it appeared more pleasant
to look like a rock but exceeding pleasant and beautifull
in great varietie, and beauty, but seemed like a rock
but a rock off wonder, the more I wondered at the how
and why more beautifull it appeared, yet no g
light, but shaded, on the right side of this rock in
sun began to arise, but it was so exceeding gloriou
I trembled, and could not behoule, then it went downe
after itt arose a little againe, but I could not bear itt,
so itt disappeared, though I had a desire to have borne itt
and looked for itt, and if I did but look toward itt
itt began to appear, as if itt did decline, that nothing
hinders its arising, but my weariednes, that would not
bear itt and thereby shewes his tendernesse to
compassionate our weariednes, being in bodys of this

Thursday June the 12th
Being desirous to remov^e this pleasant blck, and
further to understand this rock off wonder

Wher I do remaine; I see going forth of this
with many ~~numerous~~, fruitfull trees loaded, as it were
with very larg leaves, and larg pleasant fruits like
Citterions, & others amongst them, the bentyn being very
pleasant, and lovely, so also how it was planted by
so pure, still shady arden, and how varions this
roth had presented it selfe, the night before, still desir
to see farrer, itt being soitt roote in a shady plotte
not to be perfectly perceaved.

here we see but after this vnt high roth had
throw a glasse darkly other trees, thicke and those of
small leaved, and so curios, so is it had bene pur
gomeoke overspredding it, from the top to the bottom
like the side of a high hill, or mountain, after it appere
like pillows of glades, of sea greene, in great heapes

Friday the 13.

It appeared like a sea with waves, then like a
wave, the same maner of the next evening, being
the Saturday & Saboth day the 15. it appeared like a
lare Champion Chantrey Monday the 16. like a hill
Chantrey: and a brake running between two hills, vnder
I see the first pice vnder, and by this brooke appere
a roth, but not so pleasant, so that before someth
the roth seemed to haue the bath towards me, and
then was flosset: and it turned the pleasant side to
wads Tuesday ye 17. it appeared very varions like ful
of very small flowers some white some blaw
Wednesday the 18. severall floweres of green and white
and many green and white Rushes twisted with
white greene on the roth, then many small floweres
of white, and some of blaw, and pleasant round
floweres upon vpp so on looked on them.

and you gaide, and mediatly arose
Stretely to be discernable what floweres they were by
running upp so quicke, and no one disapeared other
tame. Continually full of variety of floweres, and
a swift passing away of the hills, and heauenly but
the roth stood still.

Thursday the 19.

There was a thick body of darknesse or plater of blacke
that was before, a bright light that shined vpon the
darknesse, and the light, and sighted the roth, so the
roth looked transparent, with floweres of red, and
white no other colour, asketh why red and white
only and no other colour among them, so many
floweres. It was answered to shew the purity of the
Saints when washed in the blood of the Lamb

Friday the 20.

Still this thick body of darknesse remained before the
light, I desir'd to haue, got beyond the darknesse
but could not,

Saturday the 21.

The thick body of darknesse came over me, and I was
begin to betwee the darknesse and the light (which I had
much desired) and there was so pure a say of all
Colours, as is the roth had spred its transparent
bentyn over the heauens and earth, so that it appere
a most beutifull landeship every where as in a glasse
then appeared the roth having a full sight of it, by
reason of a pure light (but yet the bath seemed to
me) I said why must I bid all the bath of it, and
not come before to see the treasured of pearls
and it turned to me where there was such treasure
of pearls so rauished expressed, over the whole
of the roth quening out of it,
heire were see but his both parte: But when were
come to see, eve to eve to see him so heire, and
changed into his glory, being made like him

And I see my selfe goe from me, as a pure body
of orientall pearl like all one pure orientall pearl
it seemes with a shinning bawty, but the bath w^t
Angel dounly towards me.

22 June Saboth day [The Idea of this bawty doth
greatly report that oþre wilde
bodysshall be made like his
glorius body].

I see the roth so gloriously adorned with goodly pearls
and pretious stunes as it was wonderfull to be beholden
so that I might plift my sight with seeing, yett after
that appeared something most rare for wonder,
It was flowers oh pearls, and with stones great
shapes of flowers, with the leaves of pearls
in curios shapes like a figure.

Monday the 23. of June

So I lay a wake a bed for so lat bath appeared
although the Ideas remoued in the day from the
first to the last, This roth still appearing in ~~the~~
its full lustre and great rith, being loaded with
many larger with stunes, and the light appeared
very splended before it, in flaming streames wher
greatly delighted me this light continued, but
the roth disappeared for some time, and there appeared
an Alter roth a flaming hart upon it, till it became
a larg flame, as big as the Alter, and at somes
distance from this Alter, appeared a most beautifull
arbor, of all pleasant flowers, transparent a yarde
length, started to bed seene at the first end
the bottome as of glasse, And I looked in to it
and went in seeing throu the flowers, The light
that lighted it was not between, but as the sun bawdy
of Gouernour pure glasse of transperant flowers, I know
have beene made transparent, and swalloured up in them,

the beauty was so great as I have don some other times
when greatly delighted (as the roth) would have been
taken into it, and would sometimes goe and sett in that
bottome of the roth under the shadow to content me
seeing I could not bee taken into it, The other I saw
flame severall times so often as I looked toward it,

the Arbor appeared varions in its flowers, to what it
had before, being larger and fewer greened, more whitish

Wednesday the 24. June.

still desirous further to behould the persons wonder of
the roth for if ever seek we shall finde it appears
with greater glory all over pearls, and a pure pleasant
light lighted it and rame over the roth, and took
it into the light, So the roth was become one with the
light, then the light gave back to one side to shew me
that the roth was in the light, and the roth appeared in
like one orient pearl, and then I understand the light
and the roth was all one glory, even the god of glory
oh great was the delight to heare Smith saye right off
that roth: which is light and bower of the beauty of
holines, I would have been taken into it, After the roth
seemes to be severall pearls unit to the roth
so of ones pearl I askes how the roth which was but
one oriental pearl, what shall I say of it, It is beyond
expression, no tongue can utter it, and I cannot saye
things that will fit to be uttered, So this person saye
well haue not songys filled to expresse, I am lost to say
about to declare, or sett it forth, in you understand whiche
glory is, then may you give a glasse to this establishyng
over powring splendens, here deate and expresse
it best by saying nothing, more, but glory glory

And bee therewith silenty) transported with the rayes
of its beauty)

But to the question: how this roth of glory, being before
but one pure pearl, how it appeared like many
united into one, It was told me, the lord was
that great pearl of price that no pearls were many
and yet united into that one pearl. It shewes the
uniuersall of the saints, when they come to that great
pearl of price, and never made one with him. They
are made one by being unites in the roth like
growing out of the won pearl, severally, every
one sonnded and made one with the roth, but each
were severally pearly - each one

Then I asked why this roth had appeared so various
before it cometh to that beauty of glory, it seeming
to be as a gross thick body at first appearance
though benifitly oppen it. It was said to declare
that the diversenes of us in saints, we cannot see these
at the first, And how they grow into this glory by
degrees, And when come to this fustnes of glory by
all ~~the~~ was done away, They were so clarified that wch
they became like transparent with the roth, Then
I desired to enter into this glorioue light, it being then
like a glorie of light, but I was told this light must
enter first into me to purifie and burne up all the
drosse, for me to be purified, to enter into this pure
light. Then I desired purifiacion, and hungered therefor
reaching forth my whole desire and affection, and
as I purifiacion came with such an overshadowing
penetrating, ray filling: and so I breathed forth
my earnest request unto it still breathing

in sweat fresh quell'd of the spiritt, penetrating me
throughout, Then I desired the saints might feel the same
I did and breathing out desired I sett as if veyne went
out to them, and vented But hasting to the fontaine
where was enough to fill me and others, for I had only
what I had retained, and wonderd if breath'd forth to
others, But this can bee say little expressed as before I
send of the roth; But it was a sweet life, power and
ventur, over pouning and filling me with joy, delight and
praise, and with such intimate familiaritie as if I might
have mid doe what I pleased conversing with god, or
with ones intimate friend, May more as with ones selfe

Thursday the 26 June

I see like a wall of stoned of gold in great bly, often
presenting it selfe, and having the roth of the roth
in my mind I desired to understand why a roth had
been so long represented to me and so various
the meditation were such as these,
first why a roth to declare it was a foundation to
stamoll be shaken. Secondly: It being placed in a
shady place and by a river, sheweth that refreshing
shaketh in the roth Jesu in the time of temptation
thirdly the pleasant greenes being severall, and often
crossed with leade, and after variety of flowers
the fullness of delight, may bee cluded to the spouse
in the Canticles. I sett under his shadow with great
delight and his spetral was sweet to my taste
flourith. Then a roth denotes security for some time
it appeared hollow where I sat, and might sett in the hollow
and be hid and safe in times of great danger
fifthly than a roth is unmoveable so that moved not
though the heauen and the earth passed swifly away
Sixthly the roth did vorsally stand with one side
towards me, and sometimes the back to declare not

We heavenly and earthly The great treasure of pearl on the
Sea, To shew the riches and treasures in god, and
that hee is not only so in himselfe, but committeth
of himself to us. Who declared in my seeing my self

being made particular of his divine nature, as of the
nature of the rothe having many pearls growing out
of this body of one pearl, so the rothe had:

There was continued that wall of stones of gold but
much higher, not to bee thymed by man, I looked
upon it as the wall of the new Jerusalem, it was
very glorious

Saturday the 28th

This golden wall I was pleased to looke over it, and I
see a pure body of light, shewing shinning gold, And
this did often present it selfe

Sabbath day the 29th

This golden wall or wall of gold, I toucht well. See
over it, and see the glory of that person like bright
shining gold, and after a pleasant light very delighting
to me met together after this golden wall seemed to compo
our meeting three courts. The first was the largest, the second
lesser than the third was like a great robe of full
with the glory of the lord like a glorious exceeding
beautiful light,

Monday the 30th June

This glorious light still continuing and greatly
delighted mee, placed in the midst of a golden porch
being filled with the glory of the lord: after appeared
a vision of carbonyt like choyce wood made curiously
in cut flowers, soon after appeared a stone building

of the colour of choyce wood int into divers worke I was
very neare it, my sie neare touching it, to discern it
readily to bee of stone,

Wednesday the first of July

This building curiously built still presented, and like
tower pinnacles at each corner one. There is this the
temple of the lord no shalbe with men, and is beaten
to tabernacle with vs. But could not understand it.
And it was denuded to a larg Champlain green plenant
place. These sweet sights and visions declared god is
coming to vs, and is in spiritt with vs by giving
such delights to the spirall eye of faith, it wee preesse
after it, this strengtheneth to beg of god to rule me
the spirall of prayght (and as Christ when on the earth
said to the deafe and dumb bee oppened) and take
my tongue and taste it and open my blinde eyes, and
there was an immediate answer with a great quaking
and refreshing, and earnest prayght with affreault that
as hee did then sett mee forth his power, hee would
answred mee, and soon after yong to sleepe (it was
after I was abed) I dreamed of much miseryment in
prayght, though some I thought come in, well I went
on not the least discomposed, I sawe the hand of
lord being the best

Wednesday the 2nd July

Being very desirous further to behold this curious
building, and it appeared at a great distance,
and not see curiously carred as before and
went leisurely down at one end as if it went
to ~~that~~ part of the globe which is against our feet
I said what is it gone to east India I often
thought of this building or temple whether
it went desiring to understand it but could
not

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(so I waited), and after there was a most glorious beautifull light displaying it self variously to great delight for some considerable time together after there was a high hill of firr trees all young, on about a foot high, then appeared in place of the firr trees cypress trees very thick like a grove with a going into it, but I could not see into it, it was soe thick and shady.

Thursday <sup>3rd of July
This great hill seemed larger and had other trees, far more beautifull than the others, and over it a great light yet it did not light the trees though it seemed to touch them, at which I wondered but had this apprehension of it, that it was light in its self although it lighted not them darkness may be near the light, yet comprehend it not, and this light went and lay on the trees like a sheet of light or white cloud and above this white cloudy beyond it there was a very large beautifull plaine the trees beneath it remaining, and the white clouds upon them, this plaine seemed very smooth & pleasant & at a distance a green field with flints and another feild with living creatures ~~but~~ ^{slaves to be men} called goats & like goats after some time this plaine was all in waving coulors shady greens very pleasant after appeared a reddish light,</sup>

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that made the plain all light of a reddish light as I desired to draw near the light to fully see it and as St Paul said we shall see him as he is and be like him, such a translating sight was this, that I was taken up into it and see my self walk toe and fro like a body of light with great satisfaction and delight, as of the same reddish light.

After there was a light coulered marble fountain curiously cut and arose higher, and larger to a very large fountain I watched very strictly to get some of the water but none came forth I looked if any small streams did appear, for sure ^{there is} water enough in it and being very thirsty for som it was said to me, the fountain indeed is full & is just ready to run over upon all nations, this did greatly stay me that god was very near & ready to come to pour out of his spirit to all nations after there was like veins of rock enameled as did wind about this fountain, which I took to be full of water, but they were close ~~seald~~ stant up

Fryday <sup>4th of July
Still I thirsted for the water out of the fountain that I might drink of this living water & be filled with the spirit & I was hale up & did drink supping it up as a thing ready to flow over, this having been my earnest request pressing for it much for a pouring forth of the spirit for the rushing powers of the holy-ghost on ~~as we did wait for it~~ & upon all the saints, this had been</sup>

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my pressing shoot the day before, the appearance of
this fountain, which fountain being ready to bee
poured forth I took to be an answer to it, ^{in vision}.
After this towards evening having had some prospect of
a return of praier concerning some relations I resol-
ved in all concerns to cast my self & mine upon the
care of God, who can doe all things as he wills, saying
let it be so, and it is soe & ever here after to obey
those commandes (as far as the Lord shall enable me)
casting your care on him, he will sustain you,
goeing to him (as indeed he is) as to our father
telling our greifs and begging his direction, & speakey
word.

Being very desirous to see this fountain poured
forth I considered it was told me the fountain not
ready I see therfore the delay is because wee are not
yet fit to receive ^{the} called me to mind the arising
of that glorious sun at beginning of the rocks
appearing which nothing hindred its arising in its
full strength & lustre, but my not being able to
bear the exceeding brightness it being an unex-
pressable glory a pressing burning fiery flame as
could not be boare

Sabbath day 9th of July

Still press ^{me} for this fountain to be poured forth
upon all flesh that all may behold his glory & in
particular I might have such a measure of it as I
might declare his immediate teaching by some
excellency in life, & soon after I see this fountain so
full, as the water swelled up even above the top:
I cried o break forth for thy glory fill our thirsty
souls, why withholdest thou seeing ^{there} enough in thy self
nay as if desired to be eas'd; Seven like breasts full
of milk to be emptied, where is the delay then,
O Lord it is in us, make us meet fitted vessels
for this new wine of the spirit that it may not
be put into old vessels O Lord, Lord, make us new
throughout, O come Lord Jesus, come quickly fill, filling
us, even soe come Lord Jesus, Lord are not these
thy one ~~ones~~ ^{ones} being then going to meet togat^r

Breathings in us, ~~the~~ Lord I know the spirit doth ^{do}
grow in me, with strong cries ~~that~~ cannot be uttered
~~red~~, & there was wrought in me a firm beleife
that god would sweetly breath his spirit amongst
us, at that time, I then being ~~going to~~ ^{about}
to meet ~~the~~ ^{the} Lord, and as wee were met togather to ^{the}
sak the Lord, for the more pouring forth of
the holy & blessed spirit of God having given us
the first fruits, though in measure, the praise &
honour be to him for any refreshments in this
our pilgrimage,

I see this fountain appear beginning to run over like a precious ointment. I was grieved it was so far above our reach that it came not into us, it declared that anointing oyle of the spirit the unction from the holy one who teacheth us all things severall times was this fountain thus presented which did procure great joy, & a firm beleife that he was coming by the ointment running a little over & fitting on the top of the fountain lying like a rich ointment, & as the spirit did thus declare in me that it was coming, soe in our freind at meeting which knew nothing of that word I had he also declared that the spirit prophesied in him he was coming, & was sweetly enlarged, & also, after, in singing of praise, with greater joyfulness then usualy.

Monday 4th of July

Having sweat breathing & overshadowing from God of all consolation, reviving & making glad the whole inward man. I was much press'd for a clear understanding of my work & duty concerning the receiving the elements of bread & wine in a sacramentall way, having been the day before at that ordinance & having for some time before it begg'd direction not fully understanding what need there was of the figure when wee had

the substance for I had fully experienced what it was to eat Christ's body & drink his blood & how it revealed to me in a very high communion & overshadowing income that this is the eating of Christ's flesh & I rejoiced in spirit & said now I know what it is, this is the eating of Christ's flesh this is the drinking of his blood I feel a vital vivifying I find Christ is come by his spirit, doe this Christ said till I come

which called to mind the cabinet I saw about the beginning of this month, & the temple being curiously cut but after not soe beautifull & how it went down & turned over to a nation against our feet & I see a people flock to it in habits like ~~fools~~ that there might be an over turn of these outward forms as to us, but might be of use to call them that had not heard whether there was a holy ghost, but to us it might depart, & wee shall not be left comfortless, but he would send his spirit for in the place appearre the most pleasant delightfull light that words are too short to express, & a fountain full ~~which~~ after followed over.

The 8th of July
Some encouragements I had to hold on our way whatev're we may meet with, if wee have lost house or land for Christ wee shall by income immediately from him receive in this life an hundred fold

the refreshment in the ways of God. the sweet delights, the ravishing joy, in the souls conversing with divine wisdom, far transcending all the painted pleasures, compared with this bliss,

Wednesday 9. July

Upon Scions meditation I finde the great and last to bee
swallowed up of ^{the} selfe ^{viz.} the mortall Sentes to be swallowed
up of immortality.
With wisdom doth by oppressing her divine treasur'd and
witho' any berty of holinesse to our invisible Sente, with
various delights, which far excedents ^{statu's} all others,
With so extreme hath not seen, nor eare heard; and to one
feeling; the over powering, overshadowing, breathings of
the Sperrit, and tasting of roys, to come, feeding on
Christ.
Iee had need keepe a strett watch against the least
motion ^{sensatio's} of life; Soone after these thoughts, we met
together, to write on the Lord, to keep that love fire
warm ^{which} will put out all earthly affections, as the
Sun puts out ^{of} fire, or darkness a candle: I saw
when met together, a pleasant green field, for
some time, but did not much observe it, ^{but} at a
suddain, like a sudden light for some time, ^{and} soon
the most beautifull shady blyns, like heaps, of clou's
& white among them, or a light ^{which} reflected in
such an unexpressable beauty, as sensitive colos
are not to be compared to it, with a bright
light by it, the Dea remained very pleasant

about 2 hours after seeing it very clear as at the
first, & the bright light, by it ^{as} a white cloud, went
leisurely over these beautifull pillars of
blen clouds, & from whence this light cloud came
arose a glorious Sun, as if it had, by ^{that} its arising
dispersed, the white cloud, & all became clear, &
I see the sun as it arose ^{till} it came to a pretty
height, there was some, little fear, in me, at
the first arising of this sun, when this Sun arise
in its strength, it will make all clouds of fearfu'ic
nature to disappear, & from our faintings will
us up rear, for perfect love is without fear;

It had a circle round the edges, of pure stream
of gold, & many people, flocking to it, eag-
erly to behold it, the ground was of gold,
rough, like very fine gravel, the people ran as
if they had a desire to worship it, so had I
being moved therunto, but did not, after (where)
this gold earth was, there appeared such a glo-
rious light many hundred times larger then the
sun before.

And so shined that it compareth to it, was but ^{as}
like the smallest candle compared with it, for light
or largeness, I said, what is this great light, it can
not be the reflection of this sun ^{that} is newly risen
for it so far excells it, that by its reflection
& beauty darkens it, surely it can be no less then
a reflection of that glory, of gloriys, as is above,
& I saw, see glorious transparent light hang

over it hovering in the air like a globe of light whose reflection this great light was.

Thursday. 10. July

Being in meditation of that Sun & ~~the~~ beauty of it & contemplating of the brightness of the fathers glory which was so transparent, beholding it with delight & filled with joy; God is all glorious ^{both} on if right hand ~~back~~, or on y^e left; even not able to contain mortall swallowed up of immortallitie (that I might not, be thus straitned) and how am I straitned to be cabin'd up in flesh, and not in the gloria liberty of the Sons of God, but I may say, as truly as Christ said ^{so may truly say} I have a baptisme of the holy ghes as with fire, to be baptized with, to purge away all dross, selfe, & sin, & how am I straitned till it comes. O I am even forced to say, turn away thy eye, for thou hast ravished me! O when shall I be able to contain, what thou, wilt give how long Lord, holy & true, wee can take in but little of glory, here, wee can hold but little of this new wine by reason of our old vessels of fles, but yet a little while he ^{wil} come, and, wee shall enter into glory, till then wee groan within our selves, with strong cries, for the redemption of the body,

Fryday <sup>11th of July
I saw a pleasant walk of gravel & trees in great exactness & an ascent above it, more pleasant with severall walks, after there was a rich & glorious building of aggats, large, & compassed with edges of gold, and joyned the aggats togather, it was like a gate, to some great city, it being high & large, then I saw another gate, very rich all of mother of pearl, and gold, and pillows of some with twisted Christell, I said surely these are the gates of the city of Jerusalem, this is like a gate house but is this to be but like the porters lodge, what must the palaces be, if this is but the gate to it, what is the chamber of presence, which is filled with oours of his glory, then I saw an open gallery with pillars of stone or marble, and speckled, with gold, on one side a well ^{almost} full of water, with a buckett, of mother of pearl, chained, with a great chain to the well</sup>

Saturday ^{12th of July}

The Dea being very refreshing to admire the great riches in God, & to contemn these things, making it our busines to wait on wisdomes teaching those beautifull discoveries, Beyond the former gates was another gate, like a porch with an arch over it, there were 6 pillars that bare up this porch 3 at a side the 4 outward most of a clear gold couler stone, very beautifull, and twisted the 2 middlemost pillars of white smooth stone, like an unpollished diamond, the cover was of divers large flatt rich stones, of severall colours, and the

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front of the porch over it & y sides of it were many beautifull flowers, of there rich stones, to great admiration, the gate within was shutt, it was a dark red colour I diligently watched to see the gate open, to goe in, after some time, it leisurely opened, & on the farthest side of the porch, there was such another gate shewing the first opened, not till some consideral time, & at first, a little, so by degrees, made me think I should not see this opened, & then considered, I desired to have it open to goe in, but alas I must not sta there, O Lord to goe in & there abide, Lord when shall it once be come to a state of fixation & no more back again, to the ruins ruinous places of the world, & finding my self greatly burnded, at this stat of absence, yea a holy impatience, but towards night the next day, I became as still, & said I bless the that thou dost declare thy beauty & excellency as refresh cordiall, in this wilderness even mine of consolation but O when, to the state of possession of father Son & Spirit.

Sabbath day 15th of July

At night after I was a bed, as for the most part then is the sweetest incom, I prayd, & obtained a sweet aquiescence, in God, I considered the great mercy I enjoyed by these openings & visions, of glory & therfore ought to bless god, O that hereby wee may be in heavenly enjoyments before our time, I mean by visiting our inheritance before our posses seeing our heitship, that although wee have not

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yet the purchased possession, yet may greatly rejoice to see what wee are redeemed to, surely joy & sorrow is very consistent with our present state, we to rejoice in hope, but O our groanings may well be born with, & doubtless are pleasing to the father of all consolation, & he as hears our groans will come to help, & stay our luggings, yea even fainting under our burdens of flesh, O wee know not how any longer to b debare our selves, help us to that birth of power under our strong cries for deliverance, that thy kingdome may come, thy will may be done, in ~~us~~ us, as it is in heaven After this I found a sweet still quietness, rejoice in the present visions & declarations of glory, his will being our great glory.

Then I see the inward gate as was shut, opened wide and was fill with a white cloud of smoke as with the glory of god, soon after this cloud was cleaved away like a long entrance went from this rich gate, in shape like an arbour, so rich with all variety of coloured rich stones: in flower all transparent, And long, so I could not see to the end, through went into it, It appeared after variou, with great treasured bery, like indeed as a passage belonging to Suth with gates and a porch as was before,

Monday July the 14th

I saw this porch with the entrance to it like an arbor very large, and att the farthest end, there were poured downe great heaps of gold pebbels, & being very exact to see what was done with them they were all laid as the pavement of this beautif.

arbour far surmounting all the riches of this world

Tuesday the 15th of July

It was much upon my mind a well as I had seen at the first seeing, of these gates, being full of water, & a bucket of mother of pearl chained to the well, this rich bucket sure is faith, chain'd by love to y^e well as we may goe & draw water of life, & strength virtue power, out of the well of salvation, O strong bands of love, as holds us, I mean gods love, who loved us first, causeth us to love him, after ^{this} I see rich beautifull stones like a wall, beginning to appear, after like a stone coat like, a coat of mail, but it was not to be pierc'd between, but all one stone, & beyond it like a beautifull arbour, & this stone arose, too exceeding hight, too the hight of a mountain which did greatly rejoice & strengthen me, the security & safety that was in god, he is a strong hold, a sure refuge, from storms & ^{the} still find it, who put their whole strength trust under y^e shadow of his wings of power.

Wednesday July 16th

Considering of this wall, & of this well O the strong chain of Gods love, as holds the buckett of faith to the well, Gods love & ours is ~~one~~ link together, Gods love is the chain, of the strong power of God, to enable us by faith to fetch strength,

life & power, out of the well of all comforts, O the love of god, we are kept by the mighty power, the chain of love power, through faith to salvation over the love of Christ constrains to obedience to doe his will that wee may have the purchase & possession which possession is no less, then himself, glorified, with the father he in the father & we in him, O that blessed union, the earnest & fervent love we have for this union, causeth these groanings, yea even faintings, for god for the living god, O when shall wee come & appear before him to see him as he is, eye to eye the our vail of flesh changed, & be made like his glorious body, that the love wherewith god hath us loved Christ may be in us, and he in us, Now, for Christ in us is the hope of glory, but then wee shall be in Christ in the possession, O never never to return to feed on visions but come to fruition At night I see that mighty high stone wall all of one, stone like a mountain it declared to me god was a strong refuge who could pierce this wall, what cannon, ~~shall~~ enter into it or above it, it greatly delighted the safety in this bulwark I asked how were these, sure they ~~were~~ must be eminent saints, such as Abraham & y^e prophets, as were so secured, it was said to me, it is my hideing place for the saints, surely Abram is there ~~that~~ and as Abram offered his only sonne the sonne of the blessing, O Lord I offer my self to thee my Isaac, the blessing as I desire to receive, which is a body here to glorie ~~me~~ in, an evangelicall body

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At thy will be done it is the blessing, & compleateth
the work of redemption here, yet I will offer this de-
sired blessing on the alter of thy will, & am willing
to live or die a dulledg of destruction being ready at
wee think to overtake us, & I thank God I offered my
blessing Isaac laying it on an alter to die to goe
to this glory, being just by it, & the great wall
gave back, & I see many people in it such as no
in bodies of flesh, & I was taken in; there indeed
was a hidding place till y^e storm was past

A place of security, & it compassed them round, &
over them as they could not be seen, and after a
little while it opened again, & the people went
out some to the right hand & some to the left a very
great company, & the great wall did goe away by
degrees with them, diffusing its self in a thin cloud
of air not much to be discerned, but went by degrees
as they went, to declare Gods speciaall presence
followed them, that where they were, he was, &
they went not out till his presence went with them,
the presence of God overshadowing us (though invi-
sible as to man) is such a defence as that bulwark
seemed when at that great strength, & after they
were gone there was a feild like a gardners
ground newly planted with herbs & flowers
with young trees, and a place plowed up in the
midst of the feild,

At night after I was a bed I see pleasant gravel
walks & grass between with great exactness & pleas-
antness then some trees & beyond it many trees &
like a wood after a storm & a swift passing of the
heavens & earth away for some time & then
a pleasant stilness all looking very quiet like
a pleasant skie reflecting the same on the earth
and large branches of flaggs growing red & white
& many saints like departed saints in white
And at the side a glimmering light as I was refreshed
at

Sabbath day the 20th of July

When wee were met togather as usually our custome
is; when one was singing a hymn of praise
I see a small door open, and a pleasant ascent of stairs
like as they were of mettals of various colour as of
gold, others of them as of all silver, some like
mixed & above it brake forth a pleasant lighthad
by degrees that it might be, the better born
at night there was a very pleasant place
much like the other, but more larger & beautifull
landscape & a greater glory of light, but there
was a thick dark body like a plate of darkness
shaded the light from me, & being very desirous

to get near the light, I pressed to get beyond the dark, and I got beyond it, & the dark plate seem to rub against my head, as one going under a low door, & then a clear light, noe shadow betw which greatly rejoiced me

Monday iij¹ 21 of July

Seeing a beautifull landscape of fields but where near them they were all of pure gold, though cast, as some cups and there shined such a pure clear strong light on this gold that the very reflection as lay on the grounde looked like a glorious sun in its full strength, this light as shined so bright came from an opening in the clouds, like a door or window, which place within was all day long one sun a globe of all light, a globe of all bright glory the globe of the earth like nothing to it for greatness, the sun, as lighteth our heavens here, looks like a bright spot to light, the heaven being many times larger
But there, the heavens, was all sun, which glory could not be beheld, but that it opened but a little, O what glorified persons shall wee then be when made able to behold pure deity, O this is the eternity of glory, no comprehending the vastness of this was pure nature which wee are, sparks of here the trinity is in unity, & unity in trinity, here is in thus, light, heat, virtue, power, light

in God the father who is the father of lights, heat which is the love of God the soul virtue which is the spirit, by which we receive, vivifying life virtue & power to subdue all our wills to himself,

Tuesday ij¹ 22 of July

Being much in contemplation of gods power who is able to perfect what he hath begun, & will to the day of redemption with meditation & consideration how God worked at first on me before I was eighteen years of age, the doubts I lay under for 6 months & then how I fell sick and see all my sins as one act ~~was~~ before me, & Hell opened, to receive me, this looked upon as most due, but after how God came in with free grace & mercy with the nitness of his spirit applying several places of scripture no longer to be disputed against, coming with such a comforting power as how heaven was opened ^{to receive me} which is mentioned more at large elsewhere in y^e beginning of y^e book, I was also considering what figure I see then, & immediately I see the ~~the~~ ^{the} heavens open, & a most pleasant beautiful angel as if clothed with flesh which I remember I had then seen stood ready to receive me, this I looked on, as only, a vision of what I had seen here before about 20 years agoe

Hereupon I was much requesting holyness throughout being the fine linnen of the saints And had some fears least this state I was in might not continue therefore desired to be with god, to behold all his wonders & glory, & I see a pleasant ascent very upright like a sky where part of it was like of the colour of rain-bows, & a light as by it I see an opening in the heavens where was one in figure like a manchild as I did joy most beautifull a little like the former as is mentioned but larger, round his head was like a sun streaming out, he was compassed as in an oval

much of the colour of a rainbow I was told that was me,
I was come up, & I might be, save I was there, because I could see
my self there, & that this was to declare to me, to assure me that
as sure as I see that there, so sure I was there, & that you
are circled in a circle of security free from danger
I thought that was not me, for I am in my body. it was
said your body you know, is not the man, that's but
the shell (I thought I see my self like a shell) but the man
is the desire, will, and affections, that's the whole of man
& that you see here. therefore you are here & see circled
with divine power to keep the whole man up with
the Lord; this did greatly stay the circle was like
~~such~~ one the colour of a rainbow, the circle of secu-
rity is my great support & it called me to mind that
I had no such cause to fear the loss of these enjoyments
for as former experience has caused some fear so likewise
there is ground of hope for after that first fearing day as
I see heaven opened to receive me, this comfort & joy contin-
ued in such a measure that for a dozen years after
more, for the most part living in joys & love of God
with the sense of his mercy, not being lifted up nor
cast down by the world or outward concernings & though
since for about ~~eleven~~ years have been led in the
wilderness to be tempted yet never to question
whether in a state of grace or a child of love but
had strong consolation that I ^{was} a child of God
as well when under the rod, for these were but
fatherly chastisements. These

They of such ickle were the meditations.

And being much rased in praise to god for his
comforts, his frequent visits, declaring his love, carrying me
out of all fleshly delights & drawing me up in
his divine imبراics, even lost in his love. then after
I see like an invisibell hand, surke & wind round & move
winding hyer, & I see a small flame wond roud, ere
I said Lord, that my affection may be always winding up me
to thee, a letill after, I see this hand like a shadow, wind against
up, but not ye other gorn thing, but followed it with the eye of
faith & it ascended winding till it came to very great
hith, yet caught it in my eye: At ye top was a flame. then
I said At Lord: Continually wind up all my affections
till they flame in love to ye: & that still wound ~~thee~~ ou
2 hier: Then another flame, I said At Lord how delightfull
full are these flames of love as com ^{from} thee & thy desirs
always to be ofered to thee, & it still wound: till it came
3 to an exceeding hith: And then A hard flame:
4 (And there was the flaming Eye of Eternity.)
And this flame was taken into yekaming eyes as into
its center: I said Lord: let me still ascend in flame of love re.
till I com to center in thy blessed eternall flaming love:
This flame was a lacy surke, of extreem bright
glittering light, in the midst A perging Eye as abideth
fixed on me, not in ye left moping of me,
And I fixed my eye w^t great strenght & comfort:
that this Eye of god w^t of alway over me,
And keepe the gladness of my heart.

And see y^e object of my heart who
knew my whole desire w^t toward him,
And desired thy ~~object~~ might be my support
hereafter, that as gods observing eye was
over us, so his preserving eye for our safety
being intwinkled in his power:

After this Eye w^t half of it shadowed w^t ~~the~~ ^{this} bright light like a lid, And it declared so
much love sweetnes Mocknes: And tender
compassion in the brightness of his love, as did
take in me so great delight & joy, that gods
eye, declared w^t w^t in god:

Both heres obseruall & glories
His observation: so his love & security w^t

After some continual Delight in this pleasant bright-
ness, I see some small bright figures by the side
of this circle of bright shining glory, they were
exceeding bright, like the same brightness as
they joyned to, but I knew not what they were
but that sure, they might bee well called Angels
of light, for they were bright as all light, this
eye of the trinity, the circle of light was
many hundred times brighter and larger then
the sun in the ~~element~~ ^{or 6} as wee see,

After some considerable time the glory of mou-
tion was opened where I see the center of the
eye, in the heart of the manifest ^{itself} glory of
the father, in great majesty with a brightness
of light about his head and a rain bow, and
the glory of the sun ^{of god} with the eye centered
in his heart, to declare the trinity the sone
in the father and the father in the sone

After this I see in a low bush ^{as growling} on the
earth ~~two~~ eyes contracted together, then I
was instructed that God was in all things ~~w^t~~
and observing and securing.

After some time, I turned to rest, and ~~the~~ ^{one} eye
appeared just before me, but not with such

a bright glory as the first, but a thin light circling round it.

I observed it for some time, and turning farther ~~there~~, then another, ^{large} eye opened like the ^{second} other and had some glimpses at first of the ^{third} but not of the first, ~~large~~ bright eye,

This eye had a very thin circle about it, and the eye was very piercing, not in the least looking of me, but looked as it were through me, I said O Lord thou canst look me into nothing who can stand before thy pure eyes? what am I to come to ~~this~~ ^{the} ~~poore~~ naked spirit ready to shrink at thy power, but Lord cloath me with the garments, of my elder brother the robe of Christ's righteousness, and then the piercing of the eye diffused into the whight circle, so that it became more thick and whightish, the circle, and the eye became shadowed with love, and sweetnesse like a lid covering it all over with love, ~~that~~ the eye was locked through this lid, this love as shadowe was declared to me to be Jesus Christ, which is the love of the father declared to us, and then what love and sweetnesse, when God's justice is covered with love, and he looketh through the lid which is ~~thine~~ his love, Jesus Christ, then wee can behold him and goe to him, Then I went out of my self in a beautifull white robe, and after went forward, a little, and

ascended by degrees, and went up to this eye and the eye opened fully and as it were reached down to take me up, an I was taken into the back of the center and middle of eye, and after some stay a thin misty body descended, where the other ascended, full of gold bright light specke, of small as specke with ones pen, and came and overshadowed me penetrating throughout, for this I praised God that as before I stood a naked spirit and so could not goe up into God, and having desired the robe of Christ's righteousness that was his divine humanity that heavenly cloth ing, now there was the spirit sent down to come in to me, to ~~make up all the~~ make it a body fitt, to carry up the soul this had a sweat reviving quickning and refreshing of my naked spirit, And after some time thinking all was over

I turned my self more fully to sleep being as to my body disturbed, and I see this eye lie on the ground as by the bed side with a thick misty circle flat on the ground, about it ga the eye very full and plain in the midst I then observed if the Lord's eye upon the earth to observe, and preserve O the Safety that is in this circle, none can come near nor hurt us

and this eye was soe near as the circle went part of it under the side of the bod being to large to goe fully under.

And after a considerable time the eye gather up into a round globe and ascended to the other eye I had seen and they both went and centred in the great circling eye, of infinite Bright glorious eternity.

After some delight in these objects I see in a shady place a shadow like a hand circle round as if it should say observe, and I did, and there was a dark earth and the earth opened and there came forth light. Ah Lord thou art light in darkness joy in mourning thou causest darkness to disappear and beyond it, in a cloud was a black Dismall darkness, very black & shut up all light, and when at blackest, there break out a clear strong light and dispere and made the darkness fly away like a cloud which made my eyes dazell as one ^{that hath been} in the sun: finding my eyes dazell I prayd that the Lord would enlighten mine eyes that I might farther understand the things concerning my soule welfare.

After I was as in the country near London in some fields and I felt a driving power to put me forward and I went towards London

and then in an other place was driven till I came to my present habitation, at the door, and then I see him ~~who~~ had driven me set him down upon the walls like a watchman, and he lookt down ~~to~~ ~~at~~ ~~the~~ ~~earth~~ so did I, where I see severall soldiers ~~come~~ ~~from~~ ~~the~~ ~~city~~ and passed ~~within~~ ~~without~~ ~~and~~ ~~went~~ ~~up~~ ~~and~~ ~~down~~ running not ~~of~~ us but the ~~other~~ ~~way~~ rather set and observed and soe did I, but not at all concerned, and a man walking on the ~~back~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~ ~~wall~~ severall aprehensi^s dangeris w^t upon mek spirits at this time.

Wednesday y^e 25th of July
Being much taken up about what had been revealed to me the night before concerning the eye of gods secrity, I see my self as the night before at the door, and the man in the like garb and like a soldier, and the soldiers as before: ~~I~~ ⁱⁿ ~~Kel~~ ^{the} ~~Hall~~ ⁱⁿ ~~the~~ ^{the} garden after many soldiers came up ^{to} ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~Hall~~ ⁱⁿ ~~the~~ ^{the} garden I kept my standing and looked down and I was standing in the eye of gods power and a misty circle on the ground round me spreading at some distane and the whole company of soldiers came to me, reaching something like a muskett but I was within the circle and they reached over it, but it would not goe off and discharge at me, many

souldiers more close together, the street full ther and I had none but the watcher and he set still and I stood still neither of us the least moved or concerned, being well assured as I was in the circle of security as they could not come neare nor hurt me thought they seemed to ~~reach~~ ^{directly} the murett to me out ~~from them~~, and soon after they all went back and fell backward like dead men.

Tuesday ^{Op} 24th of July

There were many people behind a fort of earth and behind them like a thick wood I beheld them as people seured from a common enemy.

After I see a woman in white cloathing rise up, with sore eyes, I looked on her and immediately thought she represented the church in former ages ~~whose~~ ^{her ey} were dear but weak not to see a far of, and she went down a little way, and ~~and~~ ^{and} disappeared and after another ^{woman} appeared in white raiment but very sore eyes till at last she seemed quite blind something was so thick on the sight and she ~~disappeared~~ ^{vanished} like the other,

After arose another whose eyes were very clear but he had an airy slight carriage and ~~vanished~~ again a fourth arose and that was ~~disapared~~ in garb like a man in black or sad colored cloak wrapped about him he appeared very staid and grave declaring much of gravity and understanding in his carriage and after some time he departed away ^{he was} in y figure of ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~face~~ ^{of} a man Frydays July ^{Op} 26th from cap spain to From before eleven at night till two on Saturday morning being in admiration of the power of the trinity and how it was manifested in the glories of mount Sion and Paradise, I see Paradise with the tree of life, and the center of the eye in the midst of the tree of life, & declare Gods filling Paradise.

After I see mount Sion, and the circling glory was over it like the element, or canopy of it, ^{the} eye of the trinity was always before them as I said before like a round canopy and as if mount Sion, was the reflection or a declaring of glory as was in himself; in God we cannot see what he is, he is pure deity: none knows no god is but himself & we know him by the manifestations of his glory, in mount Sion, & I see this glorious light like a cloud come down into mount Sion, filling it with his glorious

influences, & love, and it became a great thick white cloud and became between me & mount Sion that I could not see throu it, then it ascended and hung over it, after it went on y other side and stood there, then under it, then it spread it self in a thin cloud, and compassed Paradise and mount Sion taking it in like a globe, shut up, of the glorious clouds, not to be discerned, only through it, seeing some glimspes of Sions glories through this cloud, of glories, love,) then it gathered together, in a thin white cloud walking all about, in every place in mount Sions glory, filling it with his glorious presence as with great delight, in this manifesting glories: I said blessed are they, who always dwell in thy temple as shall goe noe more out, and I desired this white cloud might come over me, and it did, and told me I should not fear, for I should come thither and be a mighty champion, to receive great glory, thus for a great while did the glory of God fill it, walking and delighting in his power and glory, which was there declared, and after y same cloud compassed it and remained over it covering it up close And a little beyond it, I see a small cristall globe with great curiosity within it, all of pure cristall

but could not discern the figures within it, being very small and moved swift, then this cristall globe divided it self into a very long passage, like an arbour, of cut cristall, like a globe cut, into many arches, very beautifull and extremam long, but y longer I looked on it the less was the beauty, till at length all the beauty became dimm, and through this long place ran a swift, feirce, dark coulored strem, after I was in a long black place, and at the farthest end a black large pitt, and I thought what can be in this pitt, there nothing worth going, into this dark place to look into it, and soon after arose, out of this dark place as if it came out of the pitt a beautifull woman, most richly adorned, round her head, and above it, was rich stones, and a garment decked with all costly stones, and immediately at her back, was a rock, of the same rich stone, that came and took her into it, so that shee was fast fixed to the rock, like as if shee grew to it, and the rock roade her cloathing, which then was of a mighty largness & beautifully adorne, then it took her into the rock that shee disappeared, and after shee appeared as before like, open to the rock, and cloathed with it Whence had beheld this beauty and considered what a dark pitt it arose out, I thought it was the church of God, his Sion, as had lain long, in obscurity, among the potts, & although by the world, thought not worthy to be regarded, but shee shall arise a most beautifull church and be fixed, in that rock of glory, & shall not be moved, and this rock ascended above mount

Sion (which was covered with a cloud) and was taken into that cloud, of glory, & wrapped up, not to be seen, & was dissolved into this glory, after some while out of this cloud of light, there seemed many butifull streams of divers colors of the couler of the rock, for a great while till they streames became all like pure bright streaming gold, & after some time the streames went into their center, which was a bright goulden cloud, & there became a great stilness, thus I had been held, in admiring of this glory, above ten hours, & there came soon after, a hand pouring out a cup of blood, then I called to mind, I had seen something like it twice before, I desired now better to understand it, apprehending it signified judgment to the nation, for which I was desirous to plead yet also willing to submitt to Gods will, but also thought that if god who was not willing to bee interceded with for iniquity, by me, his works, not now, after I had beene taken into this Sunkle off his love, and he had beeorne declaring to me his glory, for ten hours, And the other time that I thought I saw blood, It was after he had shewed me great mercy, And this was the third time, and since I was now well to observe, so know Gods mind which was for me to beg mercy, and I prayd, that this god was just soe he was love, and I see the cup begin to pour, then cried I out in great hast and in bitter anguish of soul pressing towards God, and said, O Lord, good stay thine hand, the Lord seemed to put the request away as if he had saide lett me alone thou shall be safe, and as it were sheltred, the cup, that I should not see it, to be soe moved to plead for staying of it, But I pressed to see it, and it poured then, I cryd again, with the same earnest mighty

crie, O Lord God! spare thy poeple, the Lord presently replyd There shall not any one of them, be destroy but still I pressed to see the cup, and it poured, and I cried out after the same bitter crie, the third time, & said, O Lord God, spare the nation, and the Lord staid his hand, and took me up, to him and overshadowed me, in a cloud of love and held me in his diuined embraces, and asked me in great swartnes & tendernesse whether I could not be content with his will, I answered yea, Lord, I am in thy will, may it not suffice, then said thin y^r lord Spare the, and all my poeple, and I will onely destroy the wicked, yea Lord if it is thy will, to destroy them, and the lord took me up, as in his eye, and showed me the nation, and there was gathered together a great poeple, of severall statures, at the first seemed like most men, after like most women and younger persons, all having their eyes to the Lord, and many places had no body in it, the Lord said to me see this great people, a sinfull wicked nation, and are you not contented they should be destroyed, Yea Lord, If thy will, and I was soe taken into thy will of God, and above nature, that I could then, have seen any judgment, inflicted on them, and not the least moved being swallo wed up in thy will of God, then I was put down again, & his love, and I may ask, his will being in me, and I said I am now in the will of God, in thy circle of Sones with feare and trembling, Let not the lord be angry with mee, And I will prade for this nation thus as itt satisfied, nott, Moses, when thon bid him lett thee alone, to destroy, and then would make off him a great nation, hee would not lett thee alone, but prayed and prevailes

Therefore I will not lett thee goe till they spare
 this people, And while I was saying these words
 there came such a power: as I was not my selfe
 strengthening me, saying you may aske: and
 I prayed and said: oh Lord is it not for thy glory
 may not we more for thy glory: to give them
 repentence: and bring them home to thee,
 then to destroy them, Lord make thy selfe a
 great name at this day, and thou intended to
 pray all night, and the Lord seemed to leave the
 place where he had stood with his supp. and
 I see not the cup but soon after as I continued
 to pray, I see a hand stretched out with a great
 cup, and poured out and then I cried, aloud
 with a pressing towards it, in great hast, and said
 Lord, let England live in thy sight, as if I shold
 have said O Lord dost thou not hear me, all this
 while I will cri again, yet louder, and there
 went a divine hand of power, in hast, and
 snatched the cup out of the hand of justice
 and hastily caught up the blood as was poured
 out and put it in ^{one} cup, and toke it himself
 out of sight, as if it imployd to the angells
 of judgment why were you in such hast, I

will keep the cup my selfe, and when the cup was
 took out of the hand of justice, it seemed much
 smaller not above a quarter, so big, then did I
 greatly praise God and rejoice, that mercy had
 triumphed over judgment, and soe continued the
 next day in prayer and praises, oft I see as it
^{was} the next day, pour, but it was that little
 cup, but I could not bear it, but ^{was} much in earnest
 request for the staying his hand yea even to run
 between, and catch ^{the} blood till at length
 I see it noe more,

Saturday July 26

I see ^{by} the spirituall eye, a pleasant ass-
 ent of grounds, being a beautifull landscape

 more stronger the light was, in some places,
 I considered I had seen something like this severall

times lately thought none it was more beautiful and larger than before, seeing this three times I desired to know what it signified, I was told, being like feilds, it the signified the men of the world who to us, seemed, of divers apprehensions, as a Landskip beauty, is much more, to see the feilds of divers coulors, and this landskip in vision was of divers coulors, yet all rich mines in them selues that though Gods Children might be in severall workes, and for severall uses in a mysticall body, yet all together did ad to the beautie of Christianitie in different offices, all is not to be the eye where the body.

Saboth day July 27th

When I was a bed, as indeed ^{is} most is then. After some time, I see a fiery light within q curtain upon q bed and cross q bed & a pleasant waved colour place like as if it represented a ruff river, though it self had much of pleasantness in its stillness with a blazing star or commett in q middle, shining very delightfully, to my great comfort. & of a sudden there came a mighty power of darkness and all was gone nay the very Idea ^{of} reme^{re}nt, even to believe I had seen nothing, and this blackness went back like a glob & in q globe, little white things, like small pillars I looked on them, & marveled what it meant, sure this can be no other then from the dark powers, by taking away that which was so much more beautifull, this looketh not like q beauty, and treasures of wisdom, which hath noe such meane the to declare, and it was then, gone, but I had some fear

upon me, that such a, black darkness, should come between this glory, & take q, very sence, from me, that I could by noe means, think what I had seen, but my heart was earnest to the Lord in some time it was gone & this pleasant beauty, & colours came cross the bed, with q blazing star in it, and suddenly darkness came in, as a misty power, and nothing appeared but what I had seen before, like a dark globe with white things in it, causing me to fear & forget again what I had seen, but I pleaded with the Lord my security, to be incircled, with his power & there was a light at q feet of q bed, as at first not so much, but cried hard unto q Lord, & q fiery light came and strengthened me & this pleasant still river became a swift ruff troublell, thick water, & run cross q bed, as to my inward sight, of a swet current was turned, & driven all upon me, as if it came in q bed like a misty cloud, I prayed to q Lord, Lord let not q clouds swallow me up, of temptation, and immediately q current was turned upon that had turned it once me which I took to be q same Dark powers as I had before, & it run after cross q bed, & I not dismayed. Then q waters were passed away, and there became a greater fine light, then had seen before, I desired that this light might compass me that I might receive quickning power from it, and the light came like a thin fiery light or as a spirit of fire, & was cast over me like a mantell, and I prayed, & it came in like manuer, so a third time, & I was refreshed and feared not knowing I was secured, & there stood q same light, all like fiery streamings upright before me, like a sheld, ^{that} the dark powers could not come after this light, became q thick wall of light, which supported me, that they could not come, but they

came near \mathfrak{g} light (By the light gathering to me) as if they pressed upon it and \mathfrak{g} it seemed not so bright, but still I prayed that \mathfrak{g} they might fly from his presence, and the way became clear that I could see a far of, for all this while the light was \mathfrak{g} as within \mathfrak{g} curtains, and I desired this light might take me into it, and secure me, & it came all over me so that I lay as in a bed of light and covered with light. Then I feared not \mathfrak{g} enemy, and I had a light as strong from my stomach as like a son, and the light as stood at \mathfrak{g} beds feet which came to \mathfrak{m} ~~me~~ part of it so that I lay in it, as a bed of light, it ascended up and I desired to be taken in it, and my spirit was shut up close in it as in a globe: and I see the dark powers as in black shapes, reach after the light to take me out, and so compassed it, as damned it, that I could scarce see the light ~~but it would~~ than ~~was~~ ~~the~~ ~~more~~ ~~dark~~ ~~than~~ ~~that~~ ~~was~~ ~~in~~ ~~it~~ ~~but~~ ~~I~~ ~~feared~~ ~~not~~ ~~them~~ ~~but~~ ~~they~~ ~~could~~ ~~not~~ ~~hurt~~ ~~me~~ for I was, gone, up, & I was wrapped up in that white cloud, and I pray'd \mathfrak{g} friends was strengthened, and stretched my hand & bid them be gone & all darkness disappeared, and great quietness and joy and praises that as on saturday morning I rejoiced that mercy had \mathfrak{g} exalted or justice so now that light had overcome darkness and God had taken me up, above his reach, th having reached as high as they could, and \mathfrak{m} ~~you~~ taken up, and I see in this light like a bush

burning, as god appeared to moses, after all pure light, and I see a \mathfrak{g} long goe off, of this light, and new jerusalem descended in it \mathfrak{g} bride after a glorie bright glory, and so god had heard, and answered mee and delivered mee, so I desired so now I would beg for his spiritt, and so in the other night, I could have spent all the night in prayer, for the nation, so now I am willing to pray all night for his spiritt, even the meeknes of moses, the faith of abraham, the streng of samson, the wisdom of solomon, the uprightness of daves, the spirit of prophesie as daniell, that I might become as paul which was not \mathfrak{g} least of the apostles, and in all these graces begging continually humility, to receive the gift of prop
singing prophesie (opening the scripture) I mean ~~as~~ as a speciaall gift, that I had, but I received it, and should desire to use it, as a probationer, with it, so that if pride got up, it wold be gone, still continuing begging, all the gifts of the spirit, and all the graces of the spirit, as meekness, temperance, patience, prudence, and I see a small fiery stream of light come from the uppermost part of the light, and came to the lower part

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of the great light, and then came down so as I sa
id not but had faith to beleive that what I
had seen come was his spirit to fill me ~~with~~
I had been seeking, and it had passed his de
he had willed it, and sent it down though
could not see it, the spirit is compared to the
wind that we cannot see it
But had this confidence, I was answered, and
next day found a sweat flame seald upon my
heart, or soul flameing in love

This was the first time
which I had sealm, Monday the 28th of July

I had a great breathing flame strengthenin
my outward man by comforting the inward ~~life~~
vitall, and encouraged me much, and at night I see
a pleasant prospect as delighted me ~~much~~ very
large with great beauty as was no small com
that no dark powers was near me, by my seeing
so far of, which I could not ^{see} night before.

Tuesday the 29th of July

This sweat breath of flameing love continued,
and I see some pleasant prospect, as I had seen
the night before, also there were a pleasant riv
with a wood on one side and fields on the other,
how pleasantly may the love abide, as, in its an
being in ~~it~~ the inward ground, of our
minds (as this river) though in ~~it~~ most of worldly
enjoyments insuffitent.

Then the same time it appeared again, & much
larger and pleasant, but no river, after this
a still river, and the water in it was like a waved
water all ice, frozen, no motion in it, then these

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waves were raised up at one ends, and under it
was cross bars of wood, and underneath that
was a still water, ~~that~~ was sunk down, in stillness,
if our spirit awakes and refolly, — us, the still
meek love sinks down, in its own center, cannot
mingle with it, till this ruffness is rouled away
as that was, and then this still water flowed
up to the edges of the field, even to flow in
veines, to refresh the feilds), see, wee flow in
meek love, to the people of God, and give forth desires
of love, to refresh them, this I understood by some
little discomposedness on my spirits, I little per
ceived it for it did not flow as to angry expres
sions or thoughts, but still this was removed, I
found the meek love, would not mingle and flow,

Wednesday the 30th of July

Then this love flowed when the ruffness was
gone, & willing to communicate to all, and this
day, I had such a sweet flameing love, which before
I could not have imagined, neither can express,
nor should not, enlarge so much of it, but I re
ceiving it as an answer of that earnest praiier,
which I had for substance prayed often before,
but then, not being longe satisfied, I praied
till I was answered, & 27th at night, of this instant,
but hereafter I may wave the expressing it, for as
before, it cannot be expressed, but a most ravishi
joy, that the beams, of his love, is come to ing
center on our souls, and conquer and subdue all
his and our enemies, that now wee may rejoice
that the Kingdomes, of this world, is become the
Kingdomes of our Lord and his Christ, and he
will subdue all under him, and mortalls, shall be
swallowed up of immortality

At eveny I see a pleasant prospect, and smal
trees of great beauty, after many trees like a moon
the prospect when large rejoiced me, that noe
powers was near, but many times after, a snatching
the prospect out of my sight and thoughts, and
kind of fears, like a sudden surprise, on my spirit
thus severall times, but noe fear staid on me, but
only a little surprise, having a great desire
to see the saints departed, I see many together
in unity, and ascended up to mount Zion, and then
remained.

Thursday 31 of July
This day I often ~~fell~~ a flancing with great power, an
raised joy, till at last in an overpowering passiu
and restlessness, to be swallowed up of this glory,
not knowing how any longer to bear this absence
and did sing praises, but after great faintings,
(Sathan did so vex me) at night severall pleasure
prospects ~~were~~ greatly refreshed me, and noe fear
of the darkness, but often I found, such sudden
flashing again the burning love, and like a
sudden bright clasp on my hart, and some
time as if you should throw water on a fire
causing a smothering as he would stifle it &
did for the present, but soon after I foun
the life, the flame, arise, as dispells all fear
and frights

Fryday August 4, 1679

Some pleasant prospect with fields like a
Landskip

Saturday 4² of August 1679
This pleasant prospect appeared but much clearer, be-
holding it with curious observations, abundance
of ~~it~~ I had seen once before, but it was taken and
snatched away, soe that I could not tell, what I had
seen, but this morning it appeared in great beauty
The greens were like young Oringe trees, & fields
all of rich metalls, some as of gold, some of silver
in great beauty, & curiositie, a light reflecting on them, a
river went cross one side no motion, but a subtle body
or thick glass, after some considerable observation of this
riches and beautifull prospect there came one in body
figure lik of gold or fine brass, and walked to an frost
on this place, I said this is like the sonne of god.
After which a pleasant sun arose and severall times a light
yet often disturbed, with darkness, and sudden frights
with great interruption in these pleasant sights, then
I see this body of gold or fine brass, stand in a
sun, & sun lieing on a fields.

Sabbath Day 4³ of August
There was an opening upon a earth, which earth was
like pure rough gold, and upon it a circling dial
and after a globe of many dials in a earth, by
it stood, many streames of pure gold, an by that
a bright light which seemed to be there, to observe
the dial, how it moved, and there was a golden wall
diffused it self to a great length, and this light
went over a Dial, and on the other side, ascended
like a white cloud, and out of the cloud looked
out a bright eye, ~~that~~ looked on me, and the dial at
once, and after descended, and lay on a earth &
there was writing in great characters, but I could
not read it, then I prayed that I might read it

written it would not. I have seen it ^{many} years
since near 20 years, but quite forgot it but suppo
I might mistake I desired it might be writ in any
which it was writ Jehovah, then I was satisfied, sa
yng this was the name of him, I had seen sto
in that sun

And This cloud ~~was~~ had been written upon, gathered
up to gather and went on the grounde, as if somethy
alive in it, and ascended towards the eye of the
trinity, as to the circle, & came down, & went to
the ground a great way, and the eye of the
trinity looked down to it, and when it was gone
to the end of the earth, it lay still, after I
see like a front of a house of white stone cut
or engraven like a coat of armes, I could discern
little but like a rampant lion, after by this, was
a glassie large cabinet opened with doors, and se
veral curiosities moving within, and where the
of a ruff work glasse and 3 glasse pillars of a gre
highth to gather, and like a buildinge of variety

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of glass like a large gate, and the top of it
like many spirits of saints departed then I desired
to be fully satisfied whether the name I had read
Archangell was him I had seen, and I see the sun
lie on the clerke as on the grounde and the same
body stand in the sun, but not in such a plain, body
shape, and the sun was of a flameing brightness in
midst and his feet (upon it) like burning brass and
by it a name written this is the great Archangell
and I desired to be informed about the sun rising,
and then it cominge to lie on the golden earth,
it was declared in me, that the Sonne was risen &
was laid down on the center of our souls, and the
great Archangell stood in the midst whose feet
is like burning brass by which he will subdue
all sin and temptation, by his strength which strength
is as brass and burns up sin with the flames of
his love, for stronger is he as is in us then he is
against us which did much strengthen me that
I did feel this Sol or Sun was centered on my heart
and he was in me to subdue by his power, for I had
been assaulted with some monstrous sights which got
betwixt me and this beautifull gate of glass.
Then I see like a glorious woman il church set
in this glasse stately place with a loose garment
girt about her, & on the outside (of the right side) a
pure red, I asked why it was that at any time

August 5th 1679

When in bed, seeing severall yong trees, plan
very exactly on the top of a long hill, after
there was severall more trees, of all gold bran
and leaves of gold and pleasant landish
as also the most vastest landskip of feild,
seemingly all of rough gold, so beautifull,
wth a light shining on them, not to be expresse
the riches, and glories, of them, and over the
hung like a cristall closet, and pure gold
as joyned the cristall, to gather, hanging in
light, and the rich ground under it, was ex
beautifull, and glittering like diamants, and by
it a pure white stone place, curiously cut and
engraven, in front by it, an other place, cut like
a lattice and banisters, this cristall closet
appeared various with great variety and
severall wayes at last, with a large round
white stone, broad and flat, as hung on
this cristall place, and as in it & circled
round, of see nothing, it hung by, and as
turned round observing it, something
was to ascend, And I see a cristall rich

continewring, till it came to an extreme hith

The next day I see a plezent light

56 Tuesday, 8th August, 1679 where I was from friends
in Hartford, Conn.

I see by the eye of faith A pleasant prospect offered,
Some of gold, some Silver, With a reflection off a pure light
As caused them to look very beautiful, to our wondering
brightness and glory, till at length they might bee seene
throu, and looked like transparent gold and Silver
And after some time between all light, By reason of
the bright light as shines me out, turning it into its
owne nature, As it is written Once shall see him as
he is, and bee made like him. And pleasant and large
light remained a considerable time. And I was moved
much to pray and praise god: that I might bee more
thorough, And in meditation, thought what was it
that I did desire. I considered I had not lately seene
Christ, in his glorified divine humanity, as a Christian
had my acquaintance of late hath severall times. And
of my acquaintance of late hath severall times. And
so it was Wasted, and talked with him, The Lord
spake to me, and said, Why shouldest thou? It would
be but a representation of Christ without you: And it
must be Christ within you. That is yet more
that you have my flaming love which is Christ. And
that your soul, burns as in flames of love towards
me. And I was quickly raised, in comfort and joy,
With this glorious assurance, And desires still more
of god, more fully to knowe his love, which passeth
knowledge. And was all desirous, so longe
for some, in the family where I was, well knowing,
as gods peculiar way is, To minister what he commandeth
me to say (where this is common with him)
And going about, to renew my former request
The right before which was in a great measure
misunderstood, or by a faith which was thus. That as

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And by this gloriouse light where the Saints were

glory was, all darknes by a thik darknes, as twere

some time it returned more pleasant, And I saw
y pates, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and John the denarie

as I knew, with this as they were together, ther

was Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, no stod by
themselves more plaine to see, whiche I did
prayd often to see them, and now and
then Moses and Airon stod a little further

a full man, grayng browne heire. Abraham looks

Adam and Eve, they were both together: their

hairs. Then I desired to see Esayeth the
prophett, as it was said unto him a simader
with a wooden ram, he had a redish brown
hair. John the devine having a sweet
comitemente, they dware in the glory of god
and in a glond, he greatly harshed me, that
you was pleased to rendred, to inswade me,
that I might see his glory in his saints, even
those, Prophets, and Apostles
And after I saw a friend of mine he is living
as I desired to see them and shee looks
very denuely on the glorified persons of the
saints, and climes up to god high: and
ascended to a highest height, and by degrees was
rised, above, the saints: and over them to
the highest glory, till out of sight, and there
remained for some time, after a thond tame
downe, and went over the saints: and an
other went over my friend, and shee went
downe well satisfied: But much was imlurged

64 to blesse god, for thy favor wherest in this state
I would say wth the apostle Paul, even now,
whildest in the body! That now I was come to
mount Syen the City of the living god, to an
immencible Company of Saints: the spiritt of most
men made perfitt. Which did greatly raise me to
thankfullnes beyond expession.
After I desired to see my father and mother
then I desired to see a sister, he dyed abone twenty
yeres agoe, all of them having been long dead
I had never forgot them, and I saw them that they were
so very like them, that I can better remembra them
now then before. After I saw them all wchong
to walke with god, as answered, and perfect adoe
well, our will, being his, not my will, but thyne
be to oh god, is all my desire.

Wednesday 13. August.

It being with oppeng my thoughts the state of absence
from our blessed home to be illumined pillars in his
holy temple, never to bee at rest, Alwayes to beholde his
oh! the longing to bee at rest, Alwayes to beholde his
glory: No more to see through a glasse darkly, as
throun a lattis, but fure to fare, to see him as he
is, even our Lord, our head, and to be made like
him, This is the transfiguring change my soule longs
for, When, oh! when shall it come to be? And I saw a
high glond, and before it a gold doge, which
went in and out wth a border, And an arke by it,
in the glond, and like wth the glond, after therwe
was like a ladder, It reached to a great heigh,
The ladder seemed all like a glond. And up
the toppe of the ladder was like the Garret of
some house, and a Dyall. The hand stood about
10. a stolt: and I was instruted leuis vller very

desirous) to obserue his hande moving: and it was till it came to 12. a clocke, and then like a sunne diall, went off this diall, or by it, and descended, and came vnder a hond, and came to me, and there was figures written, but could not discerne what it was, only that I supposed it was a sunne diall, And there was write on it in my owne hande penteuentre, and a white glasse by it wrott in great letters, god helpes us these looked vpon us some answere to my former vnder my present thinnges, that the diall goes, and verely by the help of god will observe it, left vs possess our hearts: and watch the dials of our meete we shalbe gathered upp, when meete for the inheritance, we shall enter vpon the possession that it was nolt long, But hee shall come, will come, and will not tarry.

Thursday the 14: August

Christall

I saw like two castell pillars, to bore upp the cloudy heire, and in deep consideration how hard it was to be content to stay in meschek, and to dwell in the tents of cedar, yet also for my comfort staid my selfe, that the Patriarche, and Prophete my apostle, now glorified, was wonne to mee, And could I but discouer with Abraham who left his fathers house, and kindred, to goe to a land he knew not, yet now he would say, heaven has made abundant amends for all his travellles. O glorious glory, who can expresse what it is

6 To be in life everlasting, to bee ever in light, life, joy, and blisse, The Sente Maistre a holy impatiens, you longing to possess, I comforst 35 to say, oh that I had the wings of the morning, that I might fly away, and bee at rest, I know for the redemption of the body, not so much to bee vntethered, but to bee clothed upon, were it not for the earnest desire, and assurance of hope to be clothed upon, with the Lord Jesu, we could not shud ground,

Friday the 15. August.

I see this dayly Arth againe, and went as I were vnder a glasse, till it came by the diall, by the Marcht towards evening having a sweet flaming infiame, of divine power, it much refreshed and comforted me, to indecate of gods love, And was much taken upp, with delight and praise.

Saturday the 16. of August

In the morning I awaked, with so sweete & refreshing flame burning vpon the astro of my affections, that the effects of it was, to have melted me in teares, that the love of god was shed, thus abode in my hart.

Sabath day the 17th August

I see like a darke dome come by degrees, and passed me, and there lay a large white cloud on the ground, and there came a hand off the cloud and passed me, then another gloude, and passed me, See three times, And after I see an Asse and like some body bounde on a land on it, I thought of Abraham offering Isaac up to god, to offer upp all our rents, on the Altar of god will, to satisfie them, And I waited, to see the fire, come downe, to burne,

the Sacrifice, and often looked, but she sacrific'd
Say still, being dead, of Jesus, now will come the
Sacrificing Linse, and it was said, what needs
when it is dead already, hee needs not his
leggs to bee broken, who was dead before, alid
to Christ, I thought sure there would bee fire
to consume it, It was said no it may be
there was no need, of the Linse before, being
dead, and also further said, say when wee have
given vpp our wills, laying it vppon the Altare
wee may have, the Sacrifice againe so Abraham
when in his will, had offered vpp his heart
Sacrifice againe, And I looked with hope for
it's being given mee againe, for it began to

All I was much in being unity amongst ye saints,
that all differenced might bee done away: And that
wee might love as brethren, as children, of the
same promises, no heresie off the same glories,
having all one father, one redeemer, one comforter

Wednesday the 20. of August

Desirring what was putt vpon mee, as in petition
for one in the family, and to continuall my request
Aug I was much concerned, ad severall times
not only for him, but the rest, And at this
time was much comforted, and refreshed by god
wolde in his time, appears, being the best;
that place in the Psalm 97:11: Light is sowne
in hart; Comfort is not reaped before it bee
sowne; Wait for it,

I see a most pleasant light shone which greatly
refreshed mee, It being no less then the glory
of god, Sana and spirit, as filleth all things in
all, who is, by us, and filleth us, with his presence
And there was a golden ~~circle~~ like stream in
the middest off this light shone, to me the
golden oyle off the spirit, which comes from Christ
which is the heart, off the father, Thus by faith
we may see him, who is trinity, in unity, and
unity in trinity, oh who is able to comprehend it
but by god thus manifesting, himselfe to do,
and in god, which will raise, do, to breake forth,
oh how wonderfull art thou oh lord when god
to descrye the love of god (As in thoughts) to
admire hym, or indeavour, to expresse, what wee
cannot, his love passeth knowledge, It runneth
even at this tyme, with a flame of love, now
watered tan quent love, The leade of godly joy
is like oyle, to make it burne, the brighter

ffiday 22. August

Being often refreshed, with the glory of god, and
fresh feede off his presence, and remembraunce
of his excellencies divine humanity: I was in a deep
apprehension, off god the fathers glory and Jesus
Christ, the flaming hart of god, which is his
love, breathes into vs the breath off life by his
spirit, here is the Trinity: and what afflame
off love itt kindleth, in our bones: as David said
whilst I was musing, the fire burned, having
had a bursting, even fainting, to bee taken upp
to the mount, even to be filled with the fulnes
of him, yet filleth all in all.

For the redemption of the body: no longer to bee
in a state of absoute, and as I was in a holy
impatient, to take my flight into glory, not more
to be unites to my flesh, more verry longe, but
desirous to fly away, and be gitt rest. But the
desires being so exhort ^{stayd} all length, contred
with his visitas here, his deuine imbrated, w^t I
have had, though must come back againe, and
of them, converse beloue, And I felt such vnde
an overshadowing ~~me~~ compassing me in a
bed of love, with such soft love, vertue power
that words nor imaginationes sumot roath it,
It was an inward mouement, and swallowing upp
the whole inward man, and even the outward
That I felt the highest sweetnes of godnes loves
drawing out all my inward satiety, upon this
blessed chiret, Jesus Christ, the sum of god
even god himselfe, the eternall Trinity compassing
me with his loves, Whome I felt deuise his
life quite through me, with the idea of his
glorified person, That I then thought forded
desire no more, the ravishing joys were so great
being brought me into his banqueting howchode
and his bancke over me was loves: It was no
lesse then the infinite deere love, and
sonigall affection, he sheweth to his poore
being a brother to him in an eternall union
and mariage, Which I all that time said, So
that this was, being marred to Christ,
The rapturice of joy my sonle was then in
expeyding my selfe, But shal I haue words
to expresse, the delight, and complatenes
that the glory of god did seeme to me
take in mee? Which farre exceeded my joy

for mine was but, Quicke to sic, and seek his joye ³⁷
his seemed the joy, of a Bridegrome over his beloved
delightfull Bride, Who can declare his loves in the
plurall ~~part~~ Woe groane and long, and well me may
to behould, and bed made one with him, But oh how
now, doth he long to detache himselfe, and Comunitate to me,
hath hence declared, even now by custome my brithing
in such like satisfaction had all this time
But I must goe, bath, to that ~~which~~ hath staid mee
This is our habite ~~which~~ bindes our faulnes of
often, It is our experiance ~~which~~ bliss, Whiche the heart
this most sweete. ~~Experienceth~~ bliss, Whiche the heart
oh god which is Christ is full of, And we shall
feel more and more, as we are purifed for it,

23 August Saturday

In the morning I awaked with such yxot refreshment
and Phoenix, in flame of love on my heart,
With fresh spime imbrated, no doth very much quiet
and stay my songys, he having stayed me and
with flatyours: and Conforted with affells, so
that in the strength thereof I can now saye,
that while I fele this his inward life flaming
affire doth see greatly rejoyce me, That nothing th
in the world can ever bee compared to it
It is a feeling life, a bittell retching of the love
of god, whereby the verry outward man is strengthenyd
It is like marrow, to the bones, like strong vnde
the water of life, whiche is no^t a spring, and floweth ^{me}
vnder, or leuening water, oh that I were drunke with
thy loves, not with new wine, never, never, oh nevor
to regard any thing in the world, even see to have,
to mortall bisuillies, vpp off immortallitie, till we
come to our firavation ~~etere~~, noe more to bee
loged: nor entabmed entred vngod in flesh,
But come to the blessed and roysse liberty of the
domes of god, noe more then, noe more feared nor
sithing, But pruse, and halalust halalujah

oh happy thine happy state. Albeit a little
longer stay, some granted to be further strengthen'd
And some / Conquerions to be conquer'd, and
all my bee some world to bee done for others,
Pardon to bee begged: and mercy to be obtain'd
For others, That those ~~were~~ are afar off may be
inde nyc by the blood of the Lamb.
And in this great rapture I had much enlarged
that others might see what I then had left,
~~That we ob~~ ~~the commandment~~ ~~and love~~. All night
I found some sweet breathings, but many stra
interruptions: and dead rest in by the enemy of
our soules which at present doth well understand
but was trold, by his ~~selfe~~. But our wise
god will teach us to understand the severall
wiles of the Devil.

Sabath day. 24 August

Being sore witness of the swearing and drunkennes
of some, until it was upon my soule to its
preceding grete trouble, how the Lord so dishonored
his name prophanc'd when our holy and glorious
god hath said he will not hold them guiltless
that take his name in vain. And very much
in behing pardon, and conuictiou. Nay a thorow work
of conversion on both of them as were knowne
to me, and for the knouerne allsoe; That
god might have the glory. That the whole
world may bee filled with the glory of god.

Monday the 25. August

All night being in meditation of the love of god
and desire to have his bosome in his heart
the flaming heart, of his love, and there to be
swallow'd upp in the flames of love. It afford'd
me great delight, apprehending I was

there, and soone after I see a light like a cloud
with one sitting on it with his feete on the earth
And somdme it look'd like ~~a~~ ~~cross~~, often
like a shady fountaine, beneath this cloud of
light, wad a darkness, and under the darkness a
bright light, and this darkness, cover'd all that
light But I being very desirous to behould the
light, the darkness disappeared, and all seemed
to bee a white cloud, ~~that look'd very~~ thenceby
I wonder how walk'd in that light. But there
appeared a dark dove, and therin stuck forth
one in figure like a man; But like a monster,
and soe great was the strife, and interruption
betwixt light and darkness, good and evill
as it did greatly disturbance and discompose me, after
a great plaine of greenesse, ~~compa~~ compassed all the light
like a numerous of very small fine tree
about 4 and 6. inches high variously they appeared
and after such strange sights, But after a pleasant
light cloud compassed me, and remained whiche
was great delight by means of the beauty

Tuesday ye 26 August

Thinking of the great contest with Sathan and
his mighty power & tales to minis ~~the~~ Michael,
and his angels fighting with the Devil, and
his angels how that these fights & disturbances,
was a perfect fighting, against the appearing of
the glory of god and his ~~beauty~~, like a continual
combate. But light got the victory and remained
And this morning I saw the light sounding
I had seen the night before, and a sound
before it, like as of a cloud; and under it
a pleasant green place like young grass
Then a bright light flaming and sparkling

think

With brightness. Then like yrete breed, came
a pure white light, like a globe, being reffed
with this sight, and ~~being~~ noe interrupcione
~~had~~ I had the night before, but found great
delight, & rauished blissing, and rauising off
desirous also that I might bee free from
those frights. But ~~as~~ David which desired
he might allowed be in the light of his
countenanc, and I saw the glory of god shone
upon David with glory, & desirous might shone
alwayes upon me by the influence of his
beams of glory, shewing on me, that I
might appear faire in his sight, and
in the sight of men, doing good from his
influence remaining on me. And all night
I see a white bloud arise, and come toward
me, and ascend to a very great and
sojourning height, till at length ~~had~~ it ran
to the side of a cleare staine, and there was
taken into his glorie of great brightness,
and after upon this bright glorie a thorne
blond apparelled, and upon that a sum
~~swelled~~ round with golden streames, and
within it a large and beautiful flower, with
divers leaves with like a double haricot;
but as large as that sum, and wherethan
beheld it a considerable while it descended
and went to mount Syon, and there remained.

Wednesday the 27. August

In the morning meditating of the glory of god
the father and some of the apostle Stephen
saw it, looking steadfastly into heaven he saw
the heauen open, and the glory of god
and jesus standing on the right hand of god
And I saw a pleasant white bloud and a doore
open: and a staine like a white bloud

came forth, being filled with the glory of god, the
representation remained, before me most of the day
after. After all night I see my selfe, my angell walke
about, and sett downe by me

Thursday the 28. August

My Mornynge I saw my Angell farre more plainer, with great observation
walking to, and ~~had~~ to bee well and plaine seene
And the light shone againe very pleasant, and the
doore ~~had~~ great delight, with the tenuitie forth of
his power, communition of the love of god: which
is noe lesse then the heauens and goings forth of his
power, to fill and transport me, my eyns to
transumte me, and take me upp into his glorious
glory.

Friday the 29th August

Sweet refreshing and infargments in the love of god,
through Christ with great movements, and we are
made able to receive effect thereto appeared a
white bloud with severall partitions, like no
parties with Banisters, passing alonge:
and goinge downe all one end after this thereto
passed such a gloriouse light like severall blouds
passing, for somtyme, after the other, shewyn
his glory passing by, his backe parts, his face
cannot see being so yett not Capable to have much
aff.

Saturday the 30. August

(Being desirous for a more shewing out of his spirit
and praying that he would touch my ~~tongue~~ my
lippes ~~with~~ with a dole from his almon, that
I might speake his praise and hymns greater
glory to his name, he knowing it had beene
my desire, many yeares ever since I knew what
to desire, that I might attaine to as mirth yea-

To the soule was Capable of hence, neither could
tell how to bee content to see others doe new
good, then I thought I did well for I am in
thy will, If it is thy will, But is not thy will
well done; But no our Lord send to mary how
longe is alwaies ready; But my time is now
come, So it was said to me Ieone after
see a beautifull appearante of some Christ
curiously cutt but nolt to bee plainly discern
by reason of great interruption with the crowne
of our soules, he is diligent to take our
crownes from vs, If nolt as hee tamost
well will give all the disturbance hee can.
This curiositie cutt Christall seemed to bee like
a larg crowne, with many small things in
it like vs crownes, whiche did detaine to me
that Christ is our crowne of glory, By whiche
wee retaine our dignitie and honour, wherefore
as the rebell att from his. But great was the
strife of Iustian that it might nolt bee seen
att last it disapeared; and by it was a pure
pleasant wavy small light, like bright fl
affer, and by it a Garland some faire fruits
on the lopp off it, And about it all poured
in the youtest turriture, very small flowers
shining like gome worke or Colored glasse
or bright stoned, exceeding beaute, and as
I was considering on it, It was said the said
bright light is the marke, The yarde which
wee must passe in our age, And if wee songes
and come to the end, Wee shall have of Garlands
and off some distantes many white clouds
very beautifull, like heapes of shandes: and
these heapes of clouds went into the forme of
a building and a doore open in it, and it
was said I am the doore.

Sabbath daye v^e 31 August 1679 40
Here all were the meditations and supplications
of my soule, yett all resolving with an entire
desiracion, off all to his will, nott only in outward
worldly conuerences, But in the quicke of the holy
ghost rather then, hee coaled above measure
Although it is the great desire of my soule
(with submision to him) to bee found in his
will, To have conuincing visitts from god fresh
and daly, nay many times aday, to have renewed
my coniunction with him, and distractiōn off his glory walking
in the light of his commandments, till I come to
him, who is the ioy and recypting of my soule
Wee were not found in the will of god, and in
the coniunction of god, wee could not bee able
to haue our state off absente. But the refreshment
of my soule and whole inward and outward both
Sometime moy is so exceeding, even nolt fitt
to bee uttered, if I could they worth by noe
meanes bee expressed: But by such as has
realized them, and they know, they are better
fitt then expressed: And I see a White cloud
and apppon it a house glasse with somē
sondes in it, It declared to me it was but
waching till a few sondes more were run, and
then shold bee in paradis, And I saw most
pleasant pure light and very beautifull
pureness in beaute beyond expession, the light
being so pure, white with darke greenes, and
then all over greenes like a pleasant bowre
as sheltered inde and againe that pure milke
white light, and greenes a considerable white

Here beginneth September appearing
Monday the first off September 1679
oh! the tender love and delight wee haue in
showing vs his glory, when I mention delight
falling to mind the 22 August: 14 vols
transport mee that I am nolt able to bee

what a delight and coroyding, was then declared
Saying and skipping had it were over all
difficulties. Not being diminish all our fraulencies
and humane frailties. But having greater
refreshments, and Communion, and intimate
familiarity as a Child hath with his
indigent father. When gained upon his
affection & desire's to want what it deserved
will be, such and much exceding was this
freedom, oh asking and believeng and desiring
the request supplied; And then saw a white
Cloud by it many glorified Saints in
mount Syon, and an Angell a Seraphim with
two large golden Wings and often were
covered with a bright Cloud of glory, thow
showing his favour as a paled of glory, who
as we are able to receive: for indeed I had
this day even ever: more than I could sustaine,
But yett it admitts of longing to bee filled
for what we might receive, and declared god
yender love, which remembers we are yett
children and will/ not over charge he/
although his bowells burns about what we are
able to receive: for we are as little able
to bear his high illuminating consolations
as his withdrawings, which hath beene
experienced. But oh sterite will be affit
where to praise him in: and we filled for it;
Also when I am forced to a silent admiration,
not knowing how to contynge what I see,
makes me thinke, that there will be sometimes
beings lost in heaven, to lye downe and throw
our crowns at his feete with admiration;
sure I am it is soe now, not being able to
comprehend, that love he had soe power to
make no' his somes.

Tuesday, the 2. September. Comme
oh the flames of thy love refreshing a being from
thy sole: yet thy delighting in us, by expressing it
in such an extraordinary way; may he have rea for
a while not willingly but by constraint, ad
forsed to conuerso with relative Contango. How
seems to recouer all our returning to him
No one death when thowe behelde friend, heath been
a while absent no with greater joy: oh! how great
is his love and what may it bee compared to
even no' in a mighty monarch shoulde count and
indone to alise a poore temptable person for
to be espottred to him, what astonisshing would
it rouse not knowing how to behelde it was
possible for such a mighty prince to delight in them
How that is an infinite greater disparity betwixt
~~the~~ ^{the} length and insuffit betwixt we and the great
creature Lord of lords and King of Kings, such as hee
Lord of lords and King of Kings, such as hee
saw my contemplation. Now I saw a light, and
a tree the tree passed by the sight thond, with its
bark ~~towards~~ towards mee: and I desired to see
the other side and it turned: Some time after
there was a sum vnto the bottom, on the body of
the tree, and at length it became a great
light: and by it ~~the~~ a shadie representation of
light: and by it ~~the~~ a shadie representation of
the glorified person of Christ, that hee was
the glorified person of Christ to manifest his glory, and
coming in the Clouds to manifest his glory, and
by it a globe of glory, and then deformed it self
and became all one light.

Wednesday the 3. September
having sweete Communion I saw the glorified
person of my deare Lord Jesus, sitting on Clouds, no
with a globe vnder his feete, which was the
world, vnder clothed with a loose flowing white
garment with Silverall Spates vpon it selfe in it,
his armes spread open ready to imbrate mee
when fitted to enter therein. I would gladly
have gone into his imbrates never to haue com
forth,

But ralles to mind: how my blessed lord to me
one time, when I desired to bee taken
upp to a glorioue light, he said it must
first come into mee to make mee fit to enter
into it. It was content to stay longer from me
and said oh that I might see but by his feete and
shoelaces with a little of his garment. But see
I put by that thought. That would not suffice
if thou till yott upp to be swallowed in his
heart. After I see his heart in a great flame
of red and white stroame, and if blood and
fire flame together I asked why there seemes
blood in it. It was said we are purged by the
blood of the Sonne thorow the purfying fire of
the Sperrit. I desired to see the print of the
nails in his feete, and first seeing it in one
foote then the other very plaine, a brode flatt
marke of the head of an arrow quivring downards
in the middest, where the nake had seemlyly entered.
Then I desired to see his hand thore was all in
a flame of fire ~~for~~ a longe time, and after
he became all one pure flame, then like a
great round light. And after hee appeared
in his glorioue person agane, and his breast
rifles open, that I might see and behould
how hee loved us. I wold haue beene taken
to him, And I see one like my selfe: in a
body of flesh, goe to yoe into Christ's knest
but was put back. Then I saw my selfe
see a body of fire light, and hasted comming
to him, not questioning his admittance, and
it was immediately taken in. I then being
satisfyed I was there, and there stile arose
these flames, till at length the bloudy
stremes became like flaminie gold, so hot
it flame, not but ⁱⁿ great glory & delight
in his maiestie,

wher I haue severall times desired this to
see at. As I had before some months saide
After he left this great glorioue throne, wher
was a light ~~surpassing~~ large to the heauen
about him; and tame ~~walking~~ in his maiestie with
his blode yarmet, of glory with most of blode
and ames standing close to mee. I desired his
glorification influenced should fill mee, it did
still desiring and full filling, and desired the
father also might come to mee. And thence
cam a light brightness behind the sonne and
through him this light perced: and soe to mee,
and in mee. Then desired the sperrit and it
cam on the back of the father, through the
father and the sonne, to mee. I still receyving
and they three gowing forth of thair powder
and love, I still pressing to receyve, whole
christ and the father, and the sperrit, and did
receyve his communion till then gan no more
to receyve, oh who wold not loue him. Itemat

great pleasure and beautiful trees beyonds

ffriday v. 5. September

There was a large light like a very long stonge ring
at one end of it a brode wheel as stood still
some time, After it went rounde lozengely then
pasten then ~~lozengely~~ as in some invisible hand
turneth it. that when that turned it, it went
apace, but when left it, standeth. And when it
went ad. I thinke off the lastest something shott
like a arrow betweene the staves of the wheel
sayell ~~turne~~ ~~the arrow~~, But I see not from
where the seeinge arroved where nor what
marks they were shott at,

Saturday e. 9th 6th

thinking what this wheele ment: and thare
arrowed as passed threw the wheele in the issing
of its motion, and I saw a wheele within it: after
some inquiry I was informed: the wheele and the
motion of it was all one: being moved by a
whele within within it, which declared the
providence of god in the world: The arrowes
was so, which must take our flight threw the
whele, to the whele of our high calling: But
wee had neede begg wisdome of god his deuine
hand to help us through, the wheele of the world
the varioues turnings, and over turning, which
if it douth but touch vs it will turne vs
aside, and see hand it is to passe throw this
world, and required vs much Skill, even a deu-
skiftfull hand: as to shoot, and arrow, between
the staves of a whele, when it is moving
swifly round, and not be turned aside by it:
It may bee compared to a needle going through
the eye of a needle, or power of might turne vs
through this world, keeping vs from the well
the roos for this is the power and glory: we
will bowe and throwe our crownes at thy
feete Ichouah.

Saboth day e. 7th September

Being in contemplation of the man I had
with the lord not ~~so~~ long synt, seeing his
glorified person, and blessing god for these
injoyments, and still praysing for further

Saboth day, y^e. 14 September. 1679

In the morning I still found him, resting in his
loves, in fresh and full communions and other
shadowing presences, remaining all the day: that
still hee was allivated with mee, nothing did trouble
him with dreams, whiche seemed to mee very
wonderfull, and soone Sirde it declared his great
love so as he had some great thing to bring to
pass: and being under his shadow, hee sure can
deny mee nothing, and there was a word spoke
in mee, for mee, Lord make mee perfect, and
further I say sanctifie mee throughout, making
mee meete for the inheritance, After I spake
oh lord what will thon doe for mee
hee strok back againe, What will thon that doe
unto thee, and imediately I rephred: or one spake
in mee for mee, Lord what ever is in thy selfe to
give, and when I had said these wordes,

I thought Sire, you are drunke so with newe wine
know you, what agreat thing you have asked, I said
Lord what is not in thy selfe to give who art
our mediator, at the right hand of the father, and
one with the father, Oe equal, Oe eternall, and
what remoule thou doe

And then became a stryng, to see, and behould, what
the lord woulde doe, and he opened my stomack and
bowells, and filled them ^{ther} with part of his shadys
presence, and shadys influences, and the other part
of him over mee, for some time, and after looked very
soarthingly, caused mee to remember that place I
will search Jerusalem with smidles ~~and~~ ^{and} stellings tree
stelld, seeing his stritt observation on mee, I said
why lookest thou see on mee, lord, he said because
none but my selfe must, and I must give my selfe
up to him, as a chaste spouse, not to bee adulterated
with the world, I said bee it soe lord
to walke so well knowinge, his iclous red eye is over
me, often hee looke out my bowells remouing them
clessing them, and cast out the small darke spiritts
whiche was do the spawnes of the great one, he was
cast out before, ~~when~~ ^{when} under the bowells ~~was~~ ^{was}
to the church ~~to their~~ ^{to their} ~~to their~~ ^{to their} ~~to their~~ ^{to their}
he commanded them to depart to their owne Porter
of darkness; and when he had clessed ~~my~~ bowells

hee tooke oyle, rubing them betwene his handes, whith
shady handes & see, and himselfe like a shady figure
and when rubbed them, and oyled them a second
time, hee looked to see if they were cleane so to bee
seen through, and tooke the end of one ^{up}, and a
grenewell oyle being by him, hee poured ^{it} till all
the inside of the ^{body} were oyled theron. And I
tried out, oh then amoynted of the fether, art thou
come to annoynt me, with this pretious yode oyle
and sweete odore, not onely my boordes, but my shrews
and my hands But wasd Sylentes ^{regard} peler, and I
further said how what is this for to declare to you
that your boordes must goe no more after the death
then he tooke my liver and cleane it, and putting
out the yall throwing it from him, and pouring oyle
over it, and after into it, And I said what is this
for lord, hee said not to live to the creature
not have your life bloud plated before, but to raff
from you all yall and bitturnes, Then the spleene
Sylente, wasd emptied and cleane with oyle & oyle
pouring in it, And I said what doth this meane
and he said to have no wrath nor malite nor
passion left in you, and then wasd still, some time
and then hee said, What shalld I doe more, and I
said, lord what then pleaseth, And hee tooke my
heart and till it upon cleasing all the blak bloud

out of it a good while, and it became cleane and
a little smalle: and he closeth it upp agayne holde
it in his hand, and it sprung out a fresh, in pure
bloud severall times, and he lookes on it, and wasd
still, a good while, with great affiction and passion
even to teares, I said why lookest thou, Soe on my
heart hee said (with teares) and rauseth mee to weep
much, I looke to see that heart blest, that hath soe
often ^{been} setting bleeding for sinnes, for the inward
of corruption, and the power of temptation, which
rauseth great grefe, thyn to see his teares, to suffer
so when tempted: whith I dea soe weching even to
wash my paper with teares,
how doth hee suffer ^{now}! and there came a filling
influentes, like a breath of thyng misty air, and
in it some small thing purly white and clappid it
about my heart, so to bind it upp, It wasd said
that white, like lyly, that bound about my heart
was the lyly of purity and humilitie, and the
heart looked very pure and nobly, and after the
heart flames red, and white, sinking downe by
degrees, till it came betwene the liver, and the
spleene, and flames forth like stremes of bloud
and likke yall not mixinge, I asked, what that
wasd, I wasd told it wasd the same as I had seen
flame in the heart of Christ, whith wasd told me

to bee the blome and Sperrit to cleane and purifie, and
see contynuous flaming, till all the substance of the
heart was consumed to a flye Cole, and see lay gloving
I said if thou wist powre of thy cyke itt will flame,
and he did and itt flamed out ^{then} orgaine, and itt contynued
gloving till it had brought all into its owne nature
See that att last nothing remained of all the inwardes
But a large thicke stone of fire like fyre glasse: and
then my Jesus said now there is come for mee, and
went into my stomakte, itt being open, then came out
againe, and there went in the same thyng sperrit I
see before, like a breath of mistyaire, whiche haue rame
forth, and like from my throte to my Stomach, than
streamed downe into mee, to my Stomach to the breath
of aire, I askes what itt was, and I was caused to薄
you for his Sperrit sent in mee, I said now is nothing
left in mee, but my soule, whiche is as the breath he
said they must bee don away alloe, And onely breath
that breath as is of the holy ghost, as is breathed in
yon, to breath out to otherd, I meane as one taken out
of my selfe: yet as in my selfe, and after I felte Smt
influent, and flaming heat within, as one with whom
the Lord, had beeene warming and refreshinge, and
much in blessing god this day, when wee were mett
together I see in vision a large moone in a frame

This morning I awaked with Smt a burning gloving
heat, and filled with prays, I said oh deare lord jesus
what hast thou don to mee, thou knowest what further
is meant, then is as yett declared, Thus do annoynt mee
and take all of selfe out of mee, hee said, what I have
don thou knowest not now, but thou shalt know hereafter
I said lord I am willing to doe and suffer what thou
wilt, many times and often in the day still did the dea
appear to me of his annoynting, and how itt all sentynes
in a fyre stone, so heid consumed all into its owne
nature, Att evening sweet was the communion of his body
who is all love, the essentiale being of love, and tame
to mee all night severall tyme, till this light passed
over mee, and vnder mee, taking mee into it, this
compassing like a wall of light, and after this light
became a great swelning and a strong fyre light, like a
misty sum within it, still being in the middest, till
I was changed into the greatest refined brightnes
like a pure transparent body, empited to a casse, whiche
body was declared to be with a one as was inde mate
for glory: And as we shold have when glorified and
said this is transfiguration, like a figure of a man
but changed in nature and substance, transubstantiated
into his nature: Then was I laid done in the middest
of this exceeding bright glory: and to bed with a

Cloudy covering me: bigger than my selfe: and when has
laynes there & some time, with a stillnesse, then something
quarre med a dreading tooth and pulled mee upp: and then
like a refined bright burning Silver, streaming out all
round like bright streaming fire, all ~~at~~ so of see many
eies or powers all round. But I had noe figure but
like a fly peice of Silver, after like to red holt glasse
and founded up together it was, Then became a stillnesse
then againe changed into that sleeke bright shining body
figure, and after taken unto the pure light. It then
being like assam'd, then into a figure againe, then an
other figure with it, in the flame melting with great
joy and delight, and then made one with the flame
Thus severall times abiding in this glory, even made
one with it, natt being sensible or sturze to believe
I had any other body, then all light all glory. So that
sometimes, when I was sensible, I found some paynes
and illnes upon mee, but when in this light, felt none
Nay, when I tolde all, see much, of the Santes, so to
mind, whether I had the same pame then, and I
felt it natt, and my head was so all light, where I
had, felt the other pame ^{which was} neare my side, that allsoe
was gon, Nay, when I came fullie to my selfe, and to
regard my illnes in my head, I found it was taken away
by that power, running into my head, and filling mee

and it: and when thiser glory was over, I found with a
flame on my heart, But neither was I sensible of that
before, When so changed, because then, like all over in
light, life, and quickeing refreshment, then became Lyedat
stillnes, all Santes Shutt, After I see a small white light
like a dove, and written upon in hebreus chapterd
~~11~~ Jehovah and round it the greatest bonty like a
wall and this day ^{often} I see the invisible handes
earth and plensing, and annoyntinge my bowells, to make
me fit for this state (which is fast to bee don)

Tuesday v. 16 September. 1679
This morning I awakened being filled with praise, and
with a glouing flame, within mee, like a flame Shutt upp
so wanted to breake forth, this time will come when
thy will, wil be don in our inward earth, so it is in heaven
severall times this day, I seemed to have ~~the~~ no weighty
body, but like led is, a body of ure, or all spirit, &
At evengy I seemed againe like an ethereall body, and
a light waies to mee, then like stream'd on a beam of
light, then like a shaddowing thoyr rame, then light
rume severall tymed, ouer then rame winder mee,
and a pure succeling fire light comis mee, that I
lay in a globe, or wall, of fiery light streaming out
one the sides like the sun, after tame a white light
like a sheete, such was laid over mee,

and dabb'd back upon my stomach: and after as I
took me with ^{luck} to see: I see my face, ~~sette~~ out of a window
out of the west wall, I had seen the night before,
and was in with Clothinge, like clouted with the wall
of stoness, and divers followes like another wall
But the darke powers, did interpose, and several
interruptions before and after,

Wednesday y^r: 17:

This morning I awaked with a sweet strange powerfull flane
in me, rasing me to great joy and delight, and light
appeared, but strife against it, so that it fained somediftly
But blessed be god, who giveth us the victory, through our
Lord Jesu Christ, And though this day hath mett with the
fared thereof: and so with the evill thereof: yet the flane
gave the uppermost, and with all light tongue and sudden
all under him, even see some lord Jesu,

And the hand I saw this day, amoynting the bowels
and shyned, with much syde and hasten, as one he had
never don that part: and at evening I sawe eye come
very close to me, and it looked something perteyning
and some you, then againe it came,

And the eye was turned quite upwards, the upper part
of the lid at the bottom, then it appeared so all first
and my head was shaken, on something in it shoke it
within, then the same came within me, and took the
meat of my stomach, and shake it, and said thus shal
then bee shaken from the dust of the earth: and thus will
the Lord shake the nations, and my spiritt was caught
from me, and I became like one a sleeper, or in a trance
whose servit was broken, opp. and about tame and
spred it selfe on the earth, and on me, reaching also
to a hill, where many people walked forthright, till they
came to a land end, so disappeared: after a pure phaner
saye, and an other company of people, and this shone
was taken up and wrapped over them: and it was
turned by some invisilla hand till it seemed as if their
heads was to the ground and feete uppermost, then it
was still, and by it a shady tabernacle, then their
appeared a misty representation full of motion: and I was
guides by the eye of a friend, I saw there to looke to it
then to looke further, and there came an

unnumerable peoples, and then spheris together upon
Globe of earth, or a flat rounde peare of earth, and
went rounde it till they were so giddy, as they were
like drunken men faining ^{downe} upon one another, and so
disappeared, then by it was an other flat globe of earth
where many stood stille and still, but the earth moved
and they were moved by it, rounde: so you wold app
a watch, and when haue rounde its time, it gave a yolt
giving backe as a thing overcomyd, then it disappeared
Then a watch appeared with many figures signifying the
severall motions of it, then a Sunne diall (after the
watch was gon) with a hande diall so wadfull of motion
shaking, But I see not the howres it dropted to, and
much light appeared about it, being delighted in it, but
somethynge came and gave mee a sudden touch to mind
a place at the watch, and the rounde Sunne diall had
gon downe into, But I understand it not, though I did
desire it: Then I thought of the temple or tabernacle I
had seene, and the feet was uppermost, and all other
twisted: I saye, now god is come to shake, and over
turne, overturne, the eye was turned, upp to god

there
And when all was gon appeared upon this high hilly
eland like a fountain oppen, so broade on the top, as a
pound, and an edge of gold about it, as if it were
intwined with the riche liquor in it, or like a great busyn
of gold: and out of this brode fountain ^{was} fixed in a hilly
hill, I perceyved streames of a riche golden liquor, golden yelde
for a great while, then this fountain became a fountain
of pure water, and large, the hilly land became like
a mountaine, and the water swelleth over: and it was
said, there is a fountain oppen for Inde and Iherusalem to
wash in, large enough for syn and somelmento to bee taken
away) —

Thursday 18.

There came like a hande and passed over me part of me
three times, and my Stomach was rupper upp, and said
oppone, then came a light, where this surteyning hand had
before passed, like a Sunne to search more strightly then
with handes whiche was placed, so all the Pitt of my
Stomach, and this light was like a Sunne so shined through
me, and took me into this light, That is to saye parts
of me was like one with the light, whiche shyned like

very gold, and my upper parts to my head and breast
was rapped up like a lyly. I asked after the meaning
of it, & it was said, it was the lyly purity, and after
that lyly substance, became like transparent silver, and
was compassed so with a plond or wall, with stepps to
you upp out the plond, and above it a doore he was
open into paradise

Friday the 19th

Some small light appeared, then a white tabernacle
walled about, and an inward court walled in, and the
out court new walled in: and the west side all open
there dores, on an arched frame for dores, so if everyone had
with the rest, of white, but after the wall fell downe
tabernacle was pulled downe and ruined like a heape
this was declared god workers pull downe and destroy
what is not of his building: and I see a friend of mine
as I have seen before, on the wednesday night vision, standing
by or within the falne wall, speake very earnestly like
one a preaching, I seeing him so very earnest, was
moved to speake for him before the lord so have
formerly bieng the substance of the same, request
and I said lord what will thou doe for his name, which
hath brent so rent, as wrather thy name in him,

I was soon answered with these wordes I will raise him
upp on high and his dwelling shall not bee with men
and then, my friend being like a body of plond, turned
downe from the place where he stood, whiche was like one
a plond, and he was taken upp agayne by degrees till
passed that plond, and then came a beam of streaming
light whiche drew him upp a very great heigh till I could
see him noe more, and after some appearance, he is in the
deind part of the way againe, then where the wall was
fallen was raised in other white stone wall, but the court
not so large, but as larg as the inward court was,
and a building within it self with many windowes I saw
this is not like the other whiche had no light, but these
hath windowes and the glory of the lord filleth it, it
was all full of light comming forth at the windowes, And
I see like a window into heauen, whiche was to looke throw
to a glass to most uncontrayable pure light, and then
an other larger window of pure light and Landskippe

Saturday the 20th September 1679 to 6⁵ ^{1/2} ^{the grise book}
meditating whome the lord would delight to honour and
raise with dignity, to the ley of the power, and
there came a plond pure white written on, from the way
that the way to have his dignity, was to follow Christ which
was the way: and path of holynesse, off we went
